

Christ Is Anything but Ordinary

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ... ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flatlining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory.

Are you bored yet?

Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call.

In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question.

What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see." Andrew was looking for the Messiah — the One who makes even Ordinary Time extraordinary. The One who can sanctify the longest and dullest of to-do lists, on the longest and dullest of days. The One whose peace can reign in our homes on January 25, not just December 25.

Remember what you are looking for. Come, and you will see.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time – 17 January 2021

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19. Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10.

1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20. John 1:35-42.

Listening, Discerning and Watching, Coming, Seeing, Finding. These words ending in -ing (technically "gerunds") in the first and gospel readings indicate some continuing action. They point out good Christian behaviors as we start this winter time between the seasons of Christmas and Lent. Like Samuel, we want to be always listening for God's voice, even while needing the help of another for discerning it. Like the Baptist, we want to be watching for Jesus moving among us, looking for his activity in surprising ways in our midst and, perhaps, the surprising people around us.

- How am I coming closer to Jesus day by day, week by week?
- How am I seeing Jesus active in our world?
- How am I finding myself following Jesus without question?

Thank you from St. Vincent de Paul

Since Jan 1, 2020 we have received 443 calls and given assistance to 318 people in 157 households within St. Teresa Parish boundaries. We provided assistance of \$22,765.71 in response to those requests of 69 Ameren bills, 20 water, 39 rents, 9 sewer, and 20 other various needs including Interfaith food pantry and St. Vincent de Paul outreach shelter for the homeless. Every member of our SVDP conference contributes time, talent, and financing allowing us to operate at a cost of \$52.00 for the year, all for checks. None of this would be possible without the generosity of the Parishioners and school children of St. Teresa Parish. The members of St. Teresa SVDP and 318 of our struggling neighbors **THANK YOU** for your support.



Emmanuel in a basket of muffins and cream

In her wonderful book **Late Migrations: A Natural History of Love and Loss**, Margaret Renkl recalls the morning after her mother's sudden death — and the small miracle of resurrection she experienced in an anonymous neighbor's kindness.

"Before I was up, someone brought a basket of muffins, good coffee beans, and a bottle of cream — real cream, unwhipped — left them on the back door, and tiptoed away. I couldn't eat. The smell of coffee turned my stomach, but my head was pounding from the tears and all the what-ifs playing across my mind all night long, and I thought perhaps the cream would make a cup of coffee count as breakfast if I could keep it down.

"When I poured just a drip of cream into my cup, it erupted into volcanic bubbles in a hot spring, unspooling skeins of bridal lace, fireworks over a dark ocean, stars streaking across the night sky about a silent prairie.

"And that's how I learned the world would go on. An irreplaceable life had winked out in an instant, but outside my window the world was flaring up in celebration. Someone was hearing, "It's benign." Someone was saying, "It's a boy." Someone was throwing out her arms and crying, "Thank you!" Thank you! Oh, thank you!"

In a neighbor's simple kindness, Margaret Renkl realizes what Andrew and Peter and Philip and Nathanael discover: Emmanuel — "God is in our midst." In the Fourth Gospel, John the Baptizer points to the "Lamb of God," calling us to "behold" the presence of God in the goodness and generosity around us. In the person of Jesus, God becomes one of us, taking on our humanity in all its messiness, clumsiness, embarrassments and disappointments and shows us how to deal with it all with generosity, compassion and grace. The next step is to follow God's beloved: to focus our attention on the needs of others rather than our own wants, to find purpose in bringing joy into the lives of others rather than in the pursuit of the things the world deems as important. If we but seek it, Jesus promises, God's grace opens our eyes and hearts to behold "sparks" of the life and love of God in our midst.
