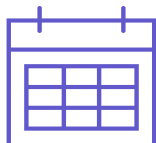

PCSS-MOUD 4 Hour Live Training

Learning Objectives:

This program will provide comprehensive background and clinical information regarding the pharmacological use of buprenorphine for opioid use disorder treatment.

By the end of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Screen and identify patients with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and define evidence-based treatments.
2. Discuss the pharmacology of opioids in relation to treating patients with OUD.
3. Describe the fundamentals of office-based opioid treatment, including addressing co-morbid conditions.
4. Explain the process of buprenorphine induction, stabilization, and maintenance.
5. Discuss all FDA-approved antagonist and agonist medications for OUD treatment.
6. Review basic office protocols, including medical record documentation and confidentiality.
7. Utilize evidence-based resources to empower providers to prescribe buprenorphine for patients with OUD.
