 READING: (40 minutes) We are beginning our poetry unit this week and will be working on this unit for the next four weeks. Please print out the packet called, "What is Poetry? - Part 1." This will be our "textbook" for this unit. If you cannot print, there are 3 copies in the 5th grade bin on the church porch. YOUR COMPLETED PACKET WILL BE A PROJECT GRADE, so keep up with the lessons. Read from poetry packet pages 1 - 3 to learn more about the different types of devices poets use in their poems. From the packet, read the poem called "Similes," on page 6 Remember - similes use the words "LIKE or AS" Complete the 3 practice pages: 7-9.
 Read through the Vocabulary Terms for List #1 - Read the definitions carefully. RELIGION: (20 minutes) Read Chapter 20: The Perfect Sacrifice MEMORY VERSE due Thursday: "One does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes forth from the mouth." Matthew 4:4 MATH: (15 minutes) Watch Mathantics video on Multiplying Fractions Complete the exercises and check your answers from the answer keys. If you do NOT understand, re-watch the video or watch the Exercises Video with "Jeremy" as he explains how to solve the problems. SOCIAL STUDIES: (15 minutes) Print out List of US Presidents (below) and read through the names. Ask your parents how to pronounce any name which may be difficult or unfamiliar to you. Watch this video to help you begin to memorize the names of all 45 presidents THE

PRESIDENTS SONG: Every United States President from George Washington to Donald Trump.

- Be thinking about the one president you would like to learn more about.
- You have Tues/Wed/Thursday to gather information and complete a report on a US president in a written report called President Report (uploaded below). This will be due on Thursday-Friday.

LATIN: (15 minutes)

• Go through your flashcards for Lesson 12 as a review of terms.

Tu READING: (20 minutes)

- Read the poem from the packet called, "The Metaphor Family," How many metaphors can you find? Have you ever used a metaphor without realizing it? Poets use this often. You will even find Jesus uses metaphors a great deal in His parables.
- Complete pages: 11-13 on metaphors.

VOCABULARY: (15 minutes)

• Find an example for each type of device (for all 15 vocabulary words) and write the example underneath the word. Example: Hyperbole: She was as skinny as a stick. Alliteration: Sally sells seashells down by the seashore (repeating s sounds).

RELIGION: (20 minutes)

- Complete workbook page 81.
- Review previous Chapters (17 20) for a test which will be open book and to be taken on Wednesday (tomorrow).
- Remember to pray the Angelus.

MATH: (20 minutes)

- Watch the video on multiplying fractions again, if you need to for better understanding.
- Review the worksheets 1 7 to make sure you understand how to multiply fractions.
- You do not need to submit these.

SOCIAL STUDIES: (20 minutes)

- Once you have chosen your president. Begin to do research on his life.
- You will need at least 2 different sources.
- Look over the report requirements to make sure you are finding all of the information.

ART: (30-40 minutes): Choose one of the three activities:

- Watch this short video on illuminated manuscripts (Don't worry about not having the pens they
 have, you can use your own) and try your hand at creating an illuminated letter: <u>How to Draw
 Illuminated Letters</u>. Illuminated manuscripts were texts that were decorated using natural
 materials such as gold in the medieval ages. Make your own illuminated letter of the first letter of
 your name, such as in this example:

RELIGION: (30 minutes)

MATH: (20 minutes) Optional Assignment to "Use what you've learned!"

- Find something you like to eat which requires you to read and follow a recipe.
- Read through the directions for the recipe for making that dish.
- Pretend you were inviting more people over and you needed to make two times that amount.
- Use notebook paper and create three columns
- In column 1: Write down the measurements of all of the ingredients from the recipe.
- In column 2: Write down the measurements you will need in order to make enough for all of your guests. This is called "doubling the recipe." which means you will multiply all of the ingredients by 2.
- Finally, pretend you only need to make half of the recipe because otherwise there would be too much food.
- In column 3: Write down the new measurements for cutting the recipe in half (multiply all the ingredients by 1/2)
- Check with a parent to make sure you are correct!!
