Remember! After our Sunday morning Masses there will be time to gather and talk with other parishioners in the Parish Center while enjoying a bit of light refreshment. Hospitality after the 8:30 and 11:00am Masses will include coffee and baked goods. **The next Saturday night hospitality will be held Saturday, June 29** - which includes hors d'oeuvres, deserts, wine and other beverages. There will be no hospitality after either Mass Sunday, June 16.

Weekday Church Availability

In order to ensure the safety of parishioners and the security of the parish campus, during the week, the church will be closed from 3:00 p.m., when the office closes, until the sacristan arrives to set up for the 5:30 p.m. Mass. On a normal weekdays, the church is available for prayer during normal business hours: Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. In order to gain access to the church during these times, please ring the bell in the courtyard outside the side porch.

Summer Office Hours

During the summer months (Memorial Day to Labor Day) the church office hours will be 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Please remember that during the summer, vacations are taken! Therefore, while the office may be open, the person you may wish to see may be out of the office. It is strongly recommended that you ALWAYS call or email in advance, to ensure that the person you hope to see, is available to see you. Subsequently, making appointments to meet with someone is greatly appreciated!

Homebound a Bit?

If you happen to be going into the hospital or if you know of a parishioner who is in the hospital, homebound, or unable to attend church any longer please let me know. We have no way of knowing if our parishioners have fallen ill and need a pastoral visit from Fr. Tony unless we are informed. So please keep me in the loop! Call or email me and when you do, be sure to make sure you leave your name and number so that I can contact you for details if necessary. THANKS so much!!

Contribution Envelope Information!!

The next set of quarterly envelopes (for July, August and September) will arrive at your home in the later part of June.

If you don't get your envelopes, lose them or forget your contribution envelope and you are paying with a check, simply write your envelope number (if you remember it) in the Memo section of the check and

fold it and drop it in the collection basket. You do not need to use one of the “Welcome” envelopes unless you are contributing with cash.

2019 Annual Appeal

If you made a pledge to the 2019 Appeal, the Diocese has begun sending reminders, so you can fulfill your pledge. It is important for all our parishioners to complete their pledges. The assistance that is provided to the ministries and programs the Appeal supports, such as grants to our mission parishes, heating and grocery assistance to families and tuition for our future priests to attend the seminary, is based on what is collected.

eGiving

If you contribute through e-Giving and prefer to not receive contribution envelopes anymore, please let me know. If you are not enrolled in e-Giving and would prefer to tithe in this manner visit our website www.saintbenedictparish.org and click on the “e-Giving” box on the bottom right corner of webpage. If you are enrolled in e-Giving, it is recommended that you check your account on a regular basis in order to review your selections as sometimes recurring may have an end date, which you may want to extend.

Address Change?

Similarly, please let me know if your email address will be changing.
