Stations of the Cross, Confessions

Lenten Concert

On **Sunday, April 7 at 7:00pm**, the parish will host a Lenten concert featuring the Richmond Concert Chorale, the Richmond-based period instrument ensemble Jefferson Baroque, and musicians from Saint Benedict. The concert will feature Dieterich Buxtehude's Lenten oratorio *Membra Jesu Nostri* (The Limbs of Our Jesus.) Written in 1680, this piece is Buxtehude's largest work. It is comprised of seven separate cantatas with biblical and sacred texts as a devotion to the body of the crucified Christ. Following the concert, a reception will be held in the Parish Center. A free-will offering will be taken up to support the musical ensembles.

Baby Bottle Campaign

Divine Mercy Chaplet

During Lent, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy will be prayed 10 minutes before weekend Masses. This devotion originated in a vision of Our Lord to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska (1905–1938), a religious of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist, and is therefore an excellent preparation for Mass. Please bring a Rosary with you, as the Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed using those beads. There will be pamphlets available that contain the prayers used in the Chaplet.

Extra Confessions

In an effort to make the Sacrament of Penance more available during Lent, confessions will be heard on Fridays from 6:00 to 7:00 pm. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7:00pm.

Palm Sunday

April 13–14, is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, which marks the beginning of Holy Week. There will be a procession from Mary garden on Sheppard Street to the church at the Sunday 11:00am Mass only. While palms will be distributed at the other Masses, this will take place in the narthex and nave of the church. (Liturgical law allows the procession at only the principal Mass on Palm Sunday.) Given the procession at the 11:00am Mass, you are kindly asked to

arrive early. Ushers will be on hand to direct traffic, in order to protect the safety of all involved, and to ensure the orderly and reverent celebration. Since the Passion is read on Palm Sunday, the Mass will take longer than normal. Therefore, it is imperative to begin on time.

Altar Server Training

A training session for altar servers will take place on **Saturday, April 6, 2019 at 10:00am**. To be an altar server, a child must be baptized, have received First Holy Communion, regularly attend Mass, and be enrolled in religious education (either through the home, the parish, or Saint Benedict School) and attend the training. *All Altar Servers are encouraged to attend this session.*

Saint Benedict Festival Choir – Easter Sunday 2019

The next appearance of the Saint Benedict Festival Choir is slated to be on **Easter Sunday, April 21st**, at the **11:00 a.m.** Mass. Parishioners, friends, and family of various ages are welcome to join. IF we have enough singers, the Festival Choir will gather to sing the Hallelujah Chorus from G.F. Handel's Messiah during Easter Sunday Mass. This year, we will be joined by a string ensemble from the studio of parishioner and teacher Loretta McCray.

- Review the music and listen to the audio recordings as you need.
- Attend AT LEAST two of three rehearsals prior to Easter Sunday. (Please attend all three if possible.)
- Attend a brief warmup and logistic briefing at 10:15 a.m. on Easter Sunday. (Singers who are not already in the parish choir will return to their pews. They will return to the choir loft, taking their places to sing after the homily.)

Rehearsals are as follows:

- Sunday, April 7th, 12:30–1:00 p.m.
- Sunday, April 14th, 12:30–1:00 p.m. (or as soon as Palm Sunday Mass is finished.)

–Wednesday, April 17th, 6:30–7:00 p.m.

Liturgical Guideline during the Flu Season

Communion under one kind

As a precaution during this especially virulent influenza season, Holy Communion under both kinds will be suspended. Until the flu abates, Holy Communion will be received only under the species of bread (that is, the Body of Christ). Please remember that receiving the Precious Blood is optional. The reason is that all of Christ is present in either the smallest particle of the consecrated bread or in the tiniest drop of the consecrated wine (concomitance). For those who can only receive Communion under the species of wine, they may approach at the end of the Communion line and the priest will administer the chalice to them.

Gesture of Peace

Furthermore, please remember that no one is ever under the obligation to shake hands during the Sign of Peace; indeed, it may be prudent to refrain from handshaking during the flu season. Rather than shaking hands, parishioners may make a statement of peace, or a bow, or some other gesture. The diocesan Office of Worship has recommended parishes consider adopting these liturgical modifications during the flu season.

Anger communicates information, motivates us, and has physical and mental consequences. The Atlantic magazine's February 2019 feature article identified anger as "the dominant emotion in our politics and personal lives." Mrs. Pamela Pilch will use her experiences in the world of law, midwifery, career counseling, and voice coaching to show how we can follow the Gospels when hearing the call to Act Against an Injustice, whether it be marching, picketing, blogging, or even just verbally correcting someone (i.e. "instruct the ignorant"). acting in forms of self-preservation and self-promotion. Join us for this Mid-Lenten and preparation for Holy Week as we seek God's Goodness while contemplating this emotion that is so frequently misunderstood!
