Leader



Bruce A. Little is, since 2018, Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary (SEBTS) and since 2012 continues to serve as the coordinator of the Francis A. Schaeffer Collection at SEBTS. In addition, while at SEBTS he was the director of the L. Russ Bush Center for Faith and Culture for five years. Saved at the age of twenty, he has served as pastor and professor in the States, as well as adjunct professor in seminaries in Europe, Africa, and Asia. Since 1995, he has given numerous lectures in universities throughout Eastern Europe as well as taught at several Youth With A Mission (YWAM) worldview schools in seven different countries. Beginning in 2002 to the present he has been involved with the ministry of Forum of Christian Leaders (FOCL) as an apologetic speaker and mentor. He has published in professional journals, is the author of *God, Why This Evil?* (2010) and *A Creation-Order Theodicy: God and Gratuitous Evil* (2004) and has a forthcoming book on Francis A. Schaeffer. He is also a contributor to several edited volumes. Since retiring in 2018, he lives with his wife Nancy in Nobleboro, Maine.

Overview

GOAL: To provide Christian apologists the proper content, encouragement, relationships, and breakthrough training that would enable their apologetics ministries to grow qualitatively and exponentially.

PLAN:

1. **2026 Pre-Forum Seminar: 16 May, Saturday:** 14:00 - 17:00. A three-hour webinar for personal introductions and introductory course material.
2. Four, two-hour online webinars with webinar assignments.
3. Three-day **Retreat** from noon to noon on **1-3 December 2026** (place TBC). Seven sessions with presentations and discussion, with some of our meals together.
4. **2027 Pre Forum Conference: Friday, 21 May - 19:15 - 21:00 CEST, Saturday, 22 May - 9:00 - 13:00 CEST.** Participants will still need to apply for the Forum and will be responsible for paying Forum fees in order to participate in the 2027 Forum. Participants must also pay for their own travel expenses.

PARTICIPANTS: Ten to twelve Christian apologists and evangelists who are willing to commit to becoming part of a learning community.

QUALIFICATIONS: All participants will be actively involved in apologetics and evangelism and be spiritually mature Christians.

COMMITMENTS: In addition to submitting an application, in order to be accepted as a participant, you must commit to:

1. Thoroughly review a selection of pre-assigned materials before and after each webinar. These assignments will consist of reading book chapters, articles, or essays as indicated for each webinar.
2. Have a proper Internet connection and a device equipped with both a microphone and video capability.
3. Attend all sessions:
 - a. **Pre-Forum Seminar at the 2026 European Leadership Forum (16 May 2026) in Wisla, Poland**
 - b. Two webinars, one in October and one in November.
 - c. **A three-day December Retreat 1-3 December 2026** (Location TBC) Seven sessions with presentations and discussion with some of our meals together.
 - d. Two, 2-hour webinars, one in February and one in March 2027.
 - e. **Pre-Forum Conference at the 2027 European Leadership Forum (from Friday, 21 May, through Saturday, 22 May). There will be one book required for this conference which is Os Guinness' *Fool's Talk* and each participant is responsible for obtaining a copy.** Participants will still need to apply for the Forum and will be responsible for paying Forum fees in order to participate in the 2027 Forum. Participants must also pay for their own travel expenses.
4. Access all webinars with a good broadband internet connection and use a headset
5. Read all assigned readings and complete assignments for each. Articles, book chapters or essays will be emailed to you before the first webinar.
6. Pay the necessary fees. The fees for **the 2026 December Retreat** are 175 Euros for a Double Room and 225 Euros for a Single Room (or 125 Euros for scholarship recipients). For **the 2027 Pre-Forum Conference**, the fees are 115 Euros for a Double Room and 165 Euros for a Single Room (or 70 Euros for scholarship recipients).
7. In order to be accepted to next years' European Leadership Forum all Year-Round Mentoring participants will need to nominate two other leaders for the following year for the Year-Round Mentoring which includes personally contacting and recruiting them by email.
