

“Kicking the Can Down the Road”

On March 3rd, the Commission on General Conference of the United Methodist Church issued a press release announcing the postponement of General Conference... again. General Conference is the only body that can speak for the United Methodist Church and they are scheduled to meet every four years.

For those keeping track, General Conference was originally scheduled for May, 2020. Because of the pandemic, it was rescheduled for 2021. As 2021 rolled around and the world still remained in various stages of lockdowns and restrictions, it was moved to August of this year.

Everything was moving towards an in-person conference in 2022. Delegates were vaccinated and boosted. Those from outside the United States were actively pursuing visas which had become more complicated in light of the precautions against international travel. Still, many had already received their travel visas and the others were in process.

So, what happened? The committee of 24 representatives decided that by this August, it would still be unsafe and too many delegates would probably not be able to make it (the vote was 14 to 9 with 1 abstention). To this observer, it seems like those 14 overly-concerned individuals were focused on an unusually gloomy prediction considering that mass gatherings have largely re-entered our society. On my vacation last month, I attended a baseball game with over 20,000 others and no one thought of it as a “super-spreader” event.

Can you sense my frustration? The top item on the agenda is a vote on the “Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation” which is a document of mediated compromise addressing the division in the denomination over the authority of scripture and human sexuality. A vote that is long overdue.

Since 2019, we have been preparing for a global conference that will decide the future of the United Methodist Church and every time we get to the brink of decision, the entire affair is postponed – this time - 2 years from now!

What upsets me the most is that I personally don't believe our laity, clergy and churches deserve this emotional roller-coaster. We deserve better. Something could have been done this year. We could have found a way to meet virtually (as the AME church did last year). We could have met with an abbreviated agenda to cover the pressing issues of the denomination. We could have even met in Africa where there were fewer restrictions (they offered).

But there's nothing we can do about it now. General Conference will be held in 2024. The “Protocol...” will still be on the agenda. Life goes on.

So, here at UMC Webster, we'll continue to focus on the mission that God has called us to: Love God, Love Others, Serve Jesus. There is a way for us to move away from the United Methodist Church, (keeping our building and assets) to a new denomination in the Wesleyan tradition or to become an independent church, but at this time it would be fairly complicated and financially prohibitive to do so. And the reality now is that the impending split in the denomination will always be hanging over our heads to some degree over the next two years.

As your pastor, I'm committed to doing our best for the kingdom of God by minimizing the distraction of separation. After all, the debates and conflicts tend to be more of an interruption to those of us in leadership than to the average church member. So, we will press on.

In this post-Easter season, we are reminded that we serve a risen Lord and no one is getting Jesus back in that tomb. Christ is alive. As the song says, when we turn our

eyes on Jesus, the things of earth grow strangely dim in the light of his glory and grace!

I'm reminded of the prophet Jeremiah's words to the Israelites: “For I know the plans I have for you,” says the Lord. “They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.” Jeremiah 29:11 (NLT)

The hope of this verse is in the future. There's no denying that life is uncertain. The Israelites were exiled from their homeland, but Jeremiah gave them hope for the future. Can we see the hope promised to the exiles as the same kind of hope that can rescue us from our stalemate? After all, we may not know for certain everything our future holds, but we know who holds the future.

Youth & Family Ministry / Worship Services

As you are reading this, most kids in New York have 4 or 5 weeks of school left. College students are well into finals and wrapping up their spring semester.

When the gift of a well-earned vacation looms, it can be hard to wait! We must remind ourselves to push through to the finish, trusting with excitement the reward will come.

At other times, our patience is tested with more challenging circumstances. Perhaps we are waiting on a diagnosis, or for a treatment plan. Maybe we're waiting on a child to finally come home or a spouse to change. Perhaps we're waiting for a paycheck to arrive or an answer to come.

And, then there are times when we are simply stuck with waiting on a decision. Sometimes our circumstances leave us in the wake of other people's choices. But, often, we find ourselves reaping what we've sown. Waiting can be emotionally and spiritually exhausting. I love the reminder the prophet Isaiah gives us about God's promise, "But those who wait on the Lord **shall renew their strength**. They shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint."

Waiting on the Lord can take many forms. In my own life, sometimes it looks like a wrestling match. In the aftermath, there is clear evidence that a struggle took place. At other times, I am better able to humble myself and tap into the Lord's patience until the time comes that the answer is revealed and my strength is renewed. I don't struggle with the Lord, but instead I surrender and trust in Him. Patience and Trust go hand in hand.

Surprisingly, the Lord taught me about this through a

horse! When I was a teenager, I purchased a horse that had been abused by his previous owner. When I first started working with him, I couldn't even stand him on cross-ties without him breaking into a full body sweat and trembling. He broke countless sets of cross-ties, and I had to chase and coax him back to the barn on a pretty regular basis. But, over time, tacking up and going for a ride was no big deal. He started looking for me and if I didn't arrive on schedule he became upset. Before I left for college he began to lose his eyesight, but I took him with me anyway and we spent the first semester trail riding through the Catskills. As he got older, he became completely blind. Many people, including my veterinarian, warned me about the dangers of working with a blind horse, let alone riding one. But, I had learned that patience developed trust, and when practiced regularly they were inseparable. When my horse was hurting and scared, I was patient. The barn manager frequently commented on how quiet I was. She often didn't know I was in the barn, sometimes for hours, until I accidentally surprised her. I was there slowly, quietly, patiently building trust with my horse. My patience with him led to a trust that was so great that we were able to continue trail riding for years after his eyesight was gone. We rode over all types of terrain, sometimes with just a halter and a lead rope - no saddle, bit, or bridle. He trusted that I was good and I would lead him on a safe path, and I trusted he would carry me.

The lesson I learned from an abused Appaloosa, was that consistency was key. Patience had to be practiced at every encounter. And, when patience was regularly applied, trust grew. I also learned the importance of being quiet. Being loud around a horse is pointless; they don't understand human language so if you're speaking it's only to hear yourself speak. Quietly pondering your next move, being gentle in your spirit, and listening were far more valuable to the relationship than any words I could speak.

For those of you in a season of waiting, I encourage you to patiently push through by trusting in God's goodness until the time comes that your strength is renewed. Quietly wrestle with the Lord if you need to, but ultimately humble yourself and surrender to His plan.
