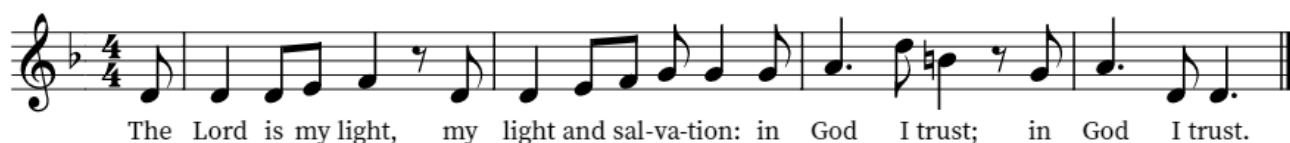

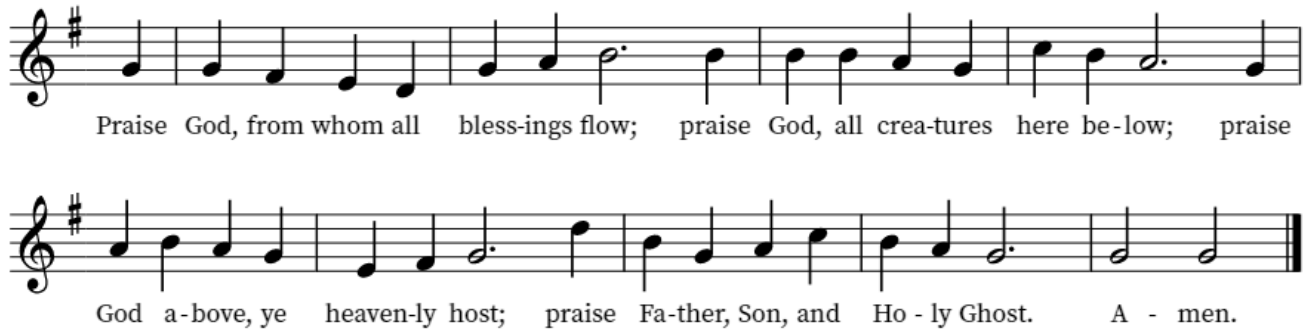
OFFERTORY ANTHEM O Pray for the Peace of Jerusalem LaVerne Miner**

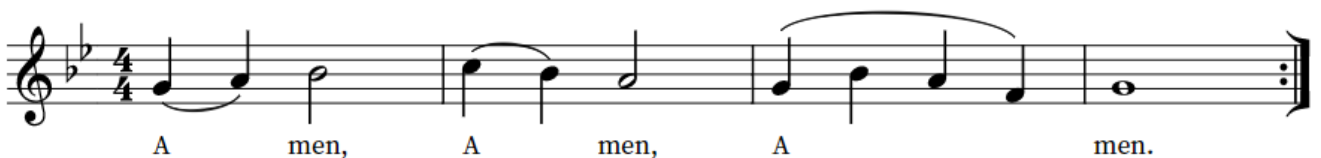

**Our celebration of Women's History Month comes very close to home, as we sing a composition of one of our own members, LaVerne Miner, during the offertory. At 16, LaVerne wrote music to Psalm 122 to help children attending Vacation Bible School at Grace Baptist Church, Germantown, PA memorize the Scripture assigned for the two weeks. In 1980, she arranged it for the senior choir of First Baptist Church, Belmont, MA. Writing music has been a hobby since she was seven years old. As for today's introit, information about the composer is sadly scarce. According to hymnary.org, "Very little is known about Lillian Bouknight (d. 1990), except that she was an African American from North Carolina, and a soloist and composer in the Pentecostal Holiness movement in the Aliquippam, PA Community, also serving as a prayer warrior and on the Mother's Board."
