Muster on the Tallapoosa Event Set for Saturday, August 19th

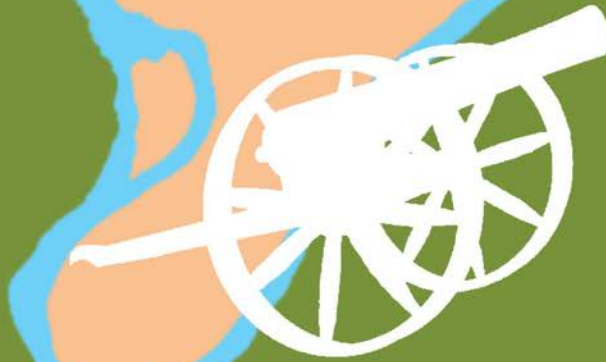
DAVISTON, AL: Horseshoe Bend National Military Park is excited to host the long running "Muster on the Tallapoosa" event on Saturday, August 19, 2017, from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. This special event focuses on daily life around the time of the Battle of Horseshoe Bend and weapons firing demonstrations. This event will also help to celebrate the fifty-eighth anniversary of the establishment of Horseshoe Bend NMP which occurred on August 11, 1959.

At 10:00 AM, 12:00 AM, 1:00 PM, and 3:00 PM, musket demonstrations will take place. Cannon demonstrations will also take place at 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM. Additionally, demonstrations of Creek Indian and frontier life as well as kid's activities will be offered throughout the day in the field directly behind the park Visitor Center. The day's activities promise to be entertaining as well as educational. No food is available for purchase in the park so visitors should plan to bring a picnic lunch and plenty of water. There are two picnic areas inside the park equipped with tables, charcoal grills, and two shelters. There is no admission charge to attend this program.
