Fall migration brings the birds that have spent their summers breeding in the northern United States, Canada and beyond, over the Southeast headed to their winter homes. With the confluence of the Coosa and Tallapoosa Rivers forming the mighty Alabama River here, we couldn't be at a better location than the beautiful grounds here at Ft. Toulouse/Ft. Jackson. But don't overlook regular & winter residents, the hawks, harriers and kestrels.

Right after the bird walk, well be unveiling a new sign at Ft. Toulouse. Provided by the Alabama Birding Trails and their partners, the sign highlights Ft. Toulouse/Ft. Jackson habitat and familiar, regular birds. The sign maps out the Piedmont Plateau Birding Trail region, as well as state-wide information about the Alabama Birding Trails.
