



## Seeds to Please!

It's definitely not too late to plant and Wheeler Library's Seed Lending Library can help! Take a look at this list and give us a call, text, or email [wheelerlibrarystaff@gmail.com](mailto:wheelerlibrarystaff@gmail.com) with your requests. We will do our best to provide what you need - *Supplies are limited on all seeds.*

Vegetables and fruit seeds available are listed below along with suggested planting times to directly sow in the garden and still get mature crops this season:

- Arugula - plant now through August
- Basil - plant now through mid June
- Beets - plant now through July
- Carrots - Direct sow now through July
- Cilantro - plant now through June
- Corn - plant now through June
- Cucumbers -Slicing and pickling - Plant now through July
- Fennel - Direct sow now through July
- Beans - *Pole and Bush* in green, purple and golden- *Lima* beans - shelling beans - can be planted through June
- Kohlrabi - plant now through mid June. Plant again in early August for fall crop

- *Lettuce*- burpee seed tapes and seed disc available as well as standard seed- can plant now and then make multiple successive sowings through August so you always have lettuce over the summer
- *Melons* - Plant now through the month of June
- *Peas*- direct sow end of July for fall crop.
- *Pumpkin* - Plant near the end of June- some bush varieties available
- *Radish* - Get repeat sowings - plant now through fall- seed tapes available
- *Rutabaga* - Plant now through July
- *Summer Squash* - plant through June and can do a second sowing if needed in July
- *Turnips* - can plant now, and again in late summer
- *Winter Squash* - plant now through the end of June, though waiting till the end of June can avoid the squash vine borer

**Flowers, too --** We have seeds that you can direct sow now through June and still see beautiful blooms this summer, including zinnias, sunflowers, marigolds, nasturtiums and calendula (both edible), morning glory, moonflower and cardinal climber.

**Last but not least** we have several seed varieties to start in home during July for transplant into garden in August for fall harvest:

- Cauliflower
- Brussel sprouts
- Broccoli
- Cabbage
