



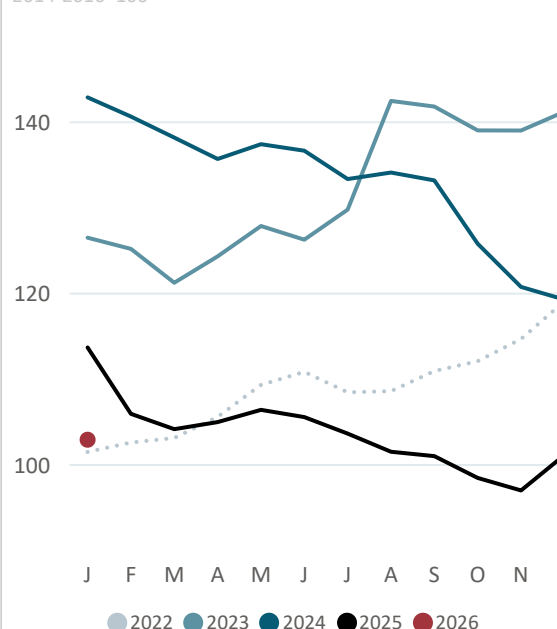
FAO RICE PRICE UPDATE

The FAO All Rice Price Index (FARPI) averaged 102.8 points in January 2026, up 1.8 percent from December 2025, but still 9.5 percent below its value a year earlier. Fragrant prices led the January increase of the FARPI. According to the Aromatic Index, they rose 7.1 percent above their December levels to a 15-month high, buoyed by demand from buyers preparing for Ramadan and the Lunar New Year. Nonetheless, Japonica quotations also edged up by 0.9 percent in January, as Calrose prices continued to draw support from tenders in the Far East, while tight supplies underpinned short-grain offers in Viet Nam. Indica quotations also strengthened by 0.7 percent in January, while Glutinous prices slid by 2.9 percent due to weak demand.

Export prices of Indica rice were mixed in the major Asian origins in January. Quotations strengthened some more in India, as public domestic procurement and sustained demand from buyers in Africa and Bangladesh overshadowed the influence of another rupee depreciation. A solid pace of sales to African destinations also kept sentiment bullish in Pakistan, where prices reached six-month highs. By contrast, quotations remained on a downtrend in Viet Nam, as sales to Filipino buyers following the 1 January removal of the Philippine's import ban on non-specialty rice proved insufficient to offset downward pressure exerted by ample inventories and subdued buying interest from other outlets. A relapse in demand also caused prices to take a downturn in Thailand, even as the baht continued to strengthen against the United States dollar. Meanwhile, amid quiet trading activities, prices moved sideways in the Americas, except in Brazil, where efforts to attract sales and large stockpiles lowered quotations, despite the real's appreciation.

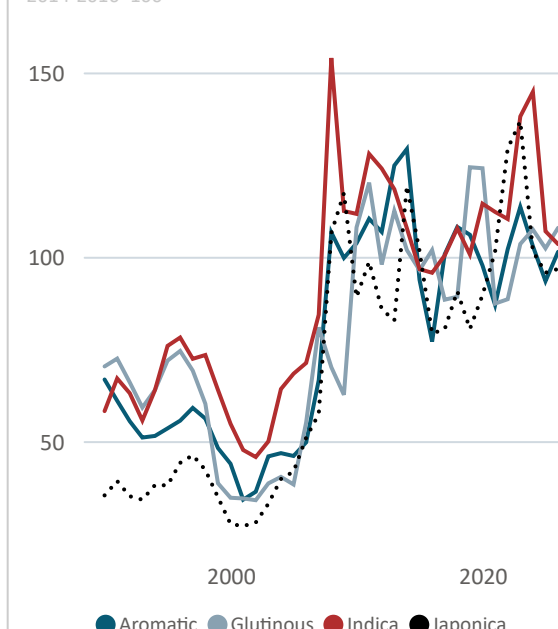
FAO ALL RICE PRICE INDEX

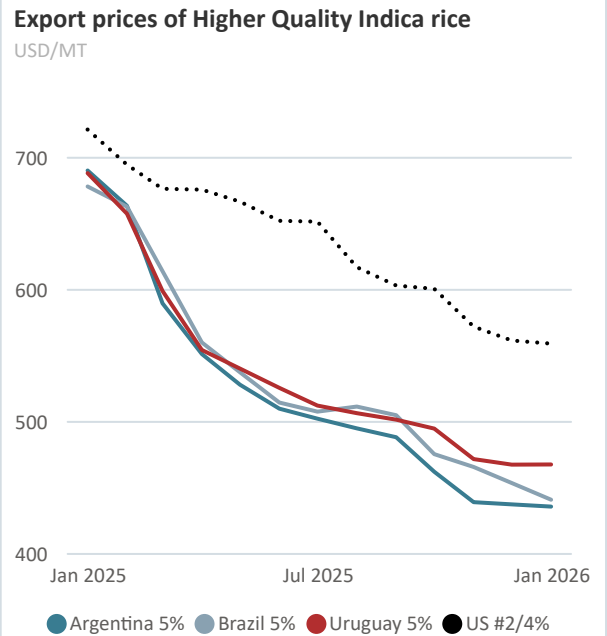
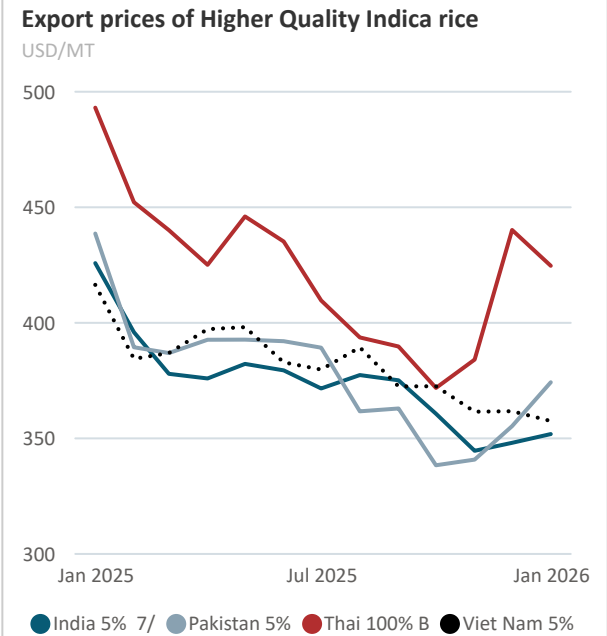
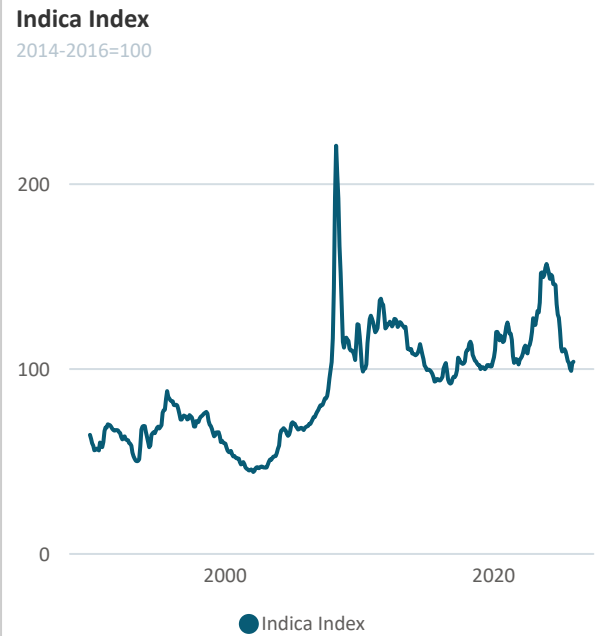

For more information on prices, you can refer to the Food Price Monitoring and Analysis Tool (<http://www.fao.org/giews/pricetool/>), which gives access to quotations of major traded products, including the high quality Thai white rice 100% B and the 100% broken rice Thai A1 Super, from 2000 onwards. The site also hosts domestic (retail or wholesale) prices for major food commodities in multiple countries.

The FAO All Rice Price Index is based on 21 rice export quotations. These quotations are combined into four groups consisting of Indica, Aromatic, Japonica and Glutinous rice varieties. Within each variety, a simple average of the relative prices of appropriate quotations is calculated; then the average relative prices of each of the four varieties are combined by weighting them with their (fixed) trade shares. "Quality" is defined by the percentage of broken kernels, with higher (lower) quality referring to rice with less (equal to or more) than 15 percent broken. The Sub-index for Aromatic rice follows movements in prices of Basmati and fragrant rice.
