













Role of a School Counselor in Career Technical Education and at DACC

- School Counselors at DACC have similar responsibilities to that of a typical School Counselor. At DACC students will see us regularly in classrooms supporting students and staff. We always make ourselves available to meet students' needs and put our students first.
- We offer individual student planning and deliver responsive services in order to assist students in developing the skills and mindset for academic, career, college and social/emotional development.
- We collaborate and consult with school personnel, parents/guardians, community partners/agencies, and our associate district school counselors to support Half and Full-Day students. We are always collaborating.
- We lead school efforts to advocate for equitable, safe, inclusive and positive learning environment for all students. We take a student-centered approach in all we do.







Scheduling

- Half-Day students are scheduled into their Level 1 labs from 7:50-10:50 a.m. for most labs. Zoo School Level 1 students attend from 12:30-3:00 p.m.
- Full-Day students, fill out the form sent through email
 - Every student takes Government for a full year (or can choose CCP POLI SCI 1100)
 - English 11 or CCP ENGL 1100
 - Math will be determined by counselors based on the student's next math sequence according to transcripts. Optional class: CCP Math - Pre-Calc
 - Science: Chemistry, Anatomy, Forensics (choose top 2)
- Our academic space and curricula is a blended model and set up to be flexible.
- Students that are most successful in this model tend to be self-starters and have the ability to work independently when needed. Teachers are always there to help support students as well.
- Our academic teachers understand students' areas of interest and will teach with that in mind.













DACC Grading Scale

- DACC teachers report grades quarterly through PowerSchool. Student grades are available to view at all times to students and parents/caregivers via PowerSchool.
- Each semester, official grades are reported to partner schools to be added to the partner schools transcript. DACC does not provide transcripts. We have our own PowerSchool, and it is not connected to home schools.

Graduation Information

- Students receive their diploma and graduate from their home high school.
 - Students still attend their home school graduation ceremony.
- Students receive a completion certificate for successfully completing their program at DACC.
 - DACC has a Completion Ceremony at the end of the year to celebrate seniors.
- We work collaboratively with the home school counselors to make sure students stay on track to meet all graduation requirements.
- All classes students take through DACC are added to their home school transcript.

DACC does not issue separate transcripts.





New Graduation Requirements (2023 and beyond)*

First, Cover the basics: Meet the minimum requirements as set by your home school district (at least 20 credits required)

English Language Arts	4 credits
Mathematics	4 credits
Science	3 credits
Social Studies	3 credits
Health	½ credit
Physical Education	½ credit
Electives	5 credits

Students must also receive instruction in Economics/Financial Literacy and complete at least 2 semesters of fine arts (the art is sometimes waived through completion of their CTE program but check with home school to be sure).

^{*}Students entering ninth grade after July 1, 2019, must meet the new requirements outlined in state law.









Second, show competency

Earn a passing score on Ohio's high school Algebra I and English II tests. Students who do not pass the test will be offered additional support and must retake the test at least once.

Is testing not your strength? After you have taken your tests, there are three additional ways to show competency!

DACC Graduation Seals

Industry-Recognized Credential Seal

Earn a 12 pt. industry recognized credential, or group of credentials totaling 12 pts.

Technology Seal

- Digital Design, Cybersecurity, Application Development, Engineering Technician, Robotics Engineering
- Successful completion of all requirements of capstone project or alternative project
- o Receive a "C" or higher each semester of course Junior & Senior year

College Credit Plus (CCP)

DACC supports students who take advantage of College Credit Plus through in-school course options as well as directly through universities. CCP is free (except when a student fails a course, then repayment is required).

CCP Requirements

- Qualifications vary by university. Qualifying grades, ACT/ SAT scores and placement testing is set by each school.
- Intent to Participate (required to be turned in by April 1, 2023) This is completed virtually when you complete the Google Form for scheduling.
- Application to the University: Completed on the university website, with the exception of the University of Findlay (which DACC takes care of). DACC classes are through Columbus State CC or Univ. of Findlay.
- Additional paperwork from schools may be required.

DACC Options for CCP (subject to change yearly)

- Jr. Year: ENGL 1100 (CSCC), POLS 1100 (CSCC), MATH 138 (Findlay), Math 139 (Findlay)
- Sr. Year: ENGL 1100 (CSCC), ENGL 2367 (CSCC), CHEM 1111 (CSCC), STATS 123 (Findlay), HIST 110 (Findlay), MATH 138 College Algebra (Findlay), Math 139 Trigonometry (Findlay), MATH 141 Calculus (Findlay)

Additional CCP Courses: Students may take additional courses at a university on their own time.

CTAGs/iTAGs & Articulation Agreements

Articulation Agreements

- Recognizes a seamless curriculum pathway from high school to an associate degree, certification, or apprenticeship program.
- Columbus State Community College, Hocking College, UNOH
- Achieve a "C" or higher in CTE courses at semester
- Apply to college: meet entrance requirements, including placement testing
- Deadlines vary: CSCC- 18 months after hs graduation; Hocking- 1 year after graduation

Career Technical Assurance Guides -CTAGS

- Can transfer to any public institution in the state of Ohio that offers same coursework
- Earn a "C" or higher in course at semester
- Pass the aligned WebXam
- Deadline: 3 years after HS graduation
