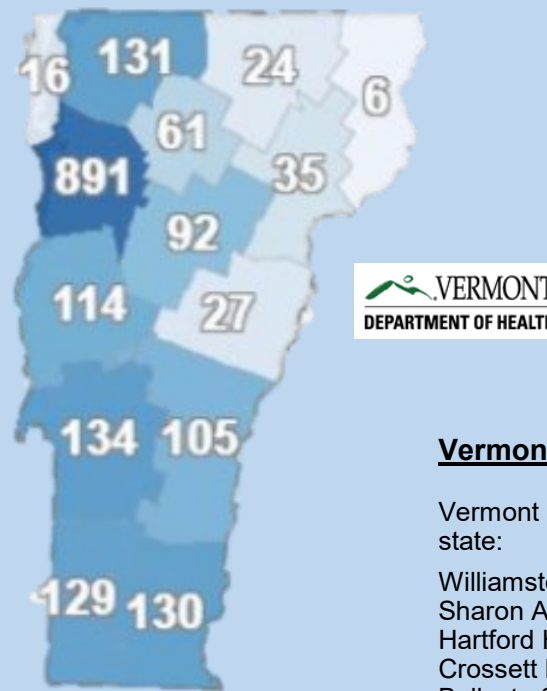

NATIONAL OVERVIEW DHS National Operations Center (NOC):

As of 15 OCT, CDC reported **7,894,768** (+366,645) COVID-19 U.S. cases and **216,025** (+4,894) domestic fatalities.

As of 15 OCT, WHO reports there are approximately **38,202,956** cases and **1,087,069** deaths worldwide.

As of the 9th of October Vermont Department of Health has identified six cases (4 recovered / 2 active).
