The story of a team of African-American women mathematicians who served a vital role in NASA during the early years of the US space program. MPAA rating: PG for thematic elements and some language.



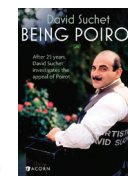
HOCUS POCUS! IT'S THE JOE FISCHER MAGIC SHOW
