Contemplative Prayer for Advent: Watch, Wait, Wonder, and Worship

These contemplative Advent liturgies look to the Sunday celebrations to practice prayer in the moods and gestures evoked in this season. In the spirit of "keeping vigil," the first week centers upon watching for Christ's coming again. The second week calls us to prayerful waiting in preparation for the coming of Jesus. Drawing upon the idea that "wisdom begins in wonder," the third week invites us to embrace imaginative wonderment at the things of God. On the fourth week, we, with Mary, sing the Lord's praises and renew our vision to do God's will.

May your home worship space be filled with semi-darkness. Our contemplation begins by lighting our Advent wreathes. The assembly responds with the lines in bold.

We gather in silence.

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

Leader: At every beginning there is a yearning for the one who is coming.

O Emmanuel,

People: **Open us up to your coming.**

We gather together to allow our deeply held hopes to be reshaped by God's promises.

O Emmanuel,

Open us up to your coming.

We wait for the day when God will make for us a future that is no longer predicated on our fear.

O Emmanuel,

Open us up to your coming.

Jesus, we welcome your presence now with the lighting of these candles, whose flames bring warmth to winter and fill us with the glow of hope. **Amen.**

We light three candles.

SUNG RESPONSE: *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, stanza 1*

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel,
that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear.
Refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

OPENING

Leader Rejoice always, pray without ceasing,
People **give thanks in all circumstances.**

PRAYER

Stir up our hearts in wonder, O God. May we wear a mantle of praise as we delight in your gift of salvation, in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah

¹The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me,
because the LORD has anointed me;
he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,
to bind up the brokenhearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives,
and release to the prisoners;
²to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor,
and the day of vengeance of our God;
to comfort all who mourn;
³to provide for those who mourn in Zion—
to give them a garland instead of ashes,
the oil of gladness instead of mourning,
the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.
They will be called oaks of righteousness,
the planting of the LORD, to display his glory.

for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation,
