





Concerning the Service

The devotion known as the Way of the Cross is an adaptation to local usage of a custom widely observed by pilgrims to Jerusalem: the offering of prayer at a series of places in that city traditionally associated with our Lord's passion and death. From the fourteen traditional places where pilgrims went for prayer, (sometimes called "stations") we have selected five scripture readings of our Lord's passion, one each night, for our meditation.


The Lord's Prayer


