Serving Bait to Rich People - about life as a ski bum/bartender, serving sushi to Aspen, Colorado's elite at chef Nobu's Matsuhisa. The NY Times called this show "bound to get noticed." And, even if nothing else ever happens in my life, I'll still claim that moment on my death bed, certain fame is right around the corner. (At whatever age I can get away with claiming now, I'm fairly clear that it's not an overnight thing.)
