French composer, Claude Debussy, composed 3 pieces about the sea for orchestra between 1903 and 1905. They are aptly titled, La Mer (The Sea). Over the years, these 3 pieces have become Debussy's most admired and most frequently performed pieces. Taking more than one and one-half years to complete, Debussy relied upon childhood memories of his visits to the sea and his passion for seascapes to bring the sea to life through his music. Throughout La Mer, his orchestration is reminiscent of crashing waves and the unpredictable nature of the sea.
