Mission

Girls To Women Mentoring Hawaii

Our Mission is to support girls to encourage and inspire each other and develop the confidence, character, skills and resilience to thrive on their journey into womanhood through school-based group mentoring programs, workshops and adventure weekends.

Girls To Women Mentoring Hawaii is a non-profit organization with a mission to support, inspire and empower adolescent girls in Hawaii through school based group mentoring circles. Girls Circles are guided by a trained senior facilitator and two or three young adult Mentors. Our programming is grounded in a foundation in gender-specific, evidence-based experiential learning which has been proven to address the needs and challenges of Adolescent Girls.

In addition, what is unique to our program is that the girls are invited to co-create the program by defining the priorities of needs and support from their own experience and that a core value of our program is to support the girls to discover and develop the resources both internal and external that are available to them from connecting with the Hawaiian culture and environment.

Our circles offer girls the opportunity to develop the skills, self-esteem, resilience, relationships and resources from within themselves and the indigenous culture and environment around them.

We give girls the confidence and tools to rise above the many challenges they face and grow into healthy, empowered, vibrant young women.

Background

GTWMH was formed in October 2017 by a group of women with a vision to share the transformative benefits of sitting women's circles to help Hawaii's teenage girls to navigate their journey into womanhood.

Some of us were fortunate to have trusted adults to turn to for encouragement as teens but all of us believe that every girl would benefit from having a safe and creative space for self-discovery and empowering peer relationships, where she receives encouragement, inspiration, affirmation and support to define and grow into her unique definition of womanhood.

Our girls program was inspired by the requests of girls in our community who noticed that their male counter-parts were being offered a program called Boys To Men. The boys to Men program was created in San Diego and has been running successfully all over the US ever since. On the Big Island, Maui and Oahu, school based group mentoring and adventure weekends are provided by Boys to Men Mentoring Network of Hawaii.

GTWMH evaluated the long term success of this program and researched gender specific needs for mentoring girls in order to design the program which will be launching in January 2019 in Pahoa and expanding to Kona in the 2019/2020 School year.

Timeline

- Girls to Women Mentoring Hawaii registered as a non-profit corporation started on the Big Island of Hawaii in October 2017.
- December 2017 Recruitment and training of 20 adult volunteer mentors
- October 1st 2018. Announcement and Fundraising Launch of Programs of school-based group mentoring circles in East Hawaii beginning in January 2019
- January 2019 Program begins a semester of circles for middle and high school circles in East Hawaii
- August 2019. Program is expanded to a year long offering in both East and West Hawaii Counties

Girls Circle® Vision

Girls and young women experience a safe, welcoming and inclusive community that offers caring, support, healthy connections and skills to navigate relational and social-emotional challenges.

Buoyed by these strengths, they grow and develop beyond imposed cultural limitations as connected, active, engaged and authentic young women.

Brief Program Description

Girls Circle® is a structured support group for pre-teen and adolescent girls and young women, and LGBTQ youth who identify with female adolescent development 9-18 years, regardless of risk level.

Girls circle integrates relational theory, resiliency practices, and skills training in a specific format designed to increase positive connection, personal and collective strengths, and competence in girls.

Originally developed in 1995, Girls Circle aims to counteract social and interpersonal forces that impede girls growth and development by promoting an emotionally safe setting and structure within which girls can develop caring relationships and use authentic voices.

Structure

- 1 or more sessions per week, depending on setting
- 60- 90 minutes
- 8 - 12 sessions or more, OR, in high transition settings (i.e., hospitals, detention, community schools) may be offered in distinct one-session units
- 5 - 10 youth of similar developmental age (or more in classroom adaptations)
- 1 or 3 trained adult female mentors as facilitators, typically
- Physically, culturally, and emotionally safe; protected, confidential
- Co-created group guidelines and expectations based in mutual respect, caring, inclusion, confidentiality
- Legal, ethical guidelines

Format

The 6-step Girls Circle format promotes safety, consistency, relationships, a range of expressive opportunities, skill building and empowerment as follows:

1. Opening Ritual
2. Theme Introduction
3. Check-in
4. Activity
5. Sharing of Activity
6. Closing Ritual

Gender specific support

Girls learn specific skills in self-awareness, emotion identification, listening, empathy, emotional identification and expression, self-regulation, interpersonal communication skills, decision-making skills.

Girls are motivated to attend when relationships are caring and consistent, and topics are relevant and applicable to their daily lives.

- Girls Circle is a relational-cultural program that creates safety and builds and restores relationships by harnessing strengths, providing respect and a listening environment and promoting skills to identify, reflect and communicate experiences amongst participants.
- Respect and other relational intentions and behaviors evoke restorative and healing experiences motivated by relationships and community support— through use of honesty, perspective-taking, self-expression, listening.
- Accountability is built into the structure of the circle, beginning with development of group agreements by participants and by their application during sessions.
- Girls develop social problem-solving skills, especially by listening and sharing as well as through targeted skill building for communication, emotional expression, and develop optimism that relationships can heal and that, amongst girls, relationships can be a resource of genuine support, friendship, healing, and repair.
