At the conclusion of a recent workshop, the leader suggested a gratitude circle. One participant share their belief in God—and how wrong they believe atheists are. Something like this had never happened at a workshop of ours, and at that moment, I wasn't sure how to react, or whether I should. On reflection, I think I should have, and here's what I might have said:

There may be atheists in this circle who, like all of us, just spent the last three hours marveling at the wonders of nature. We shared that experience, and were connected by it. But when we declare at the end that those marvels prove others are wrong for what they believe, we broke bond we just built.

School of Ranch's mission is to bring people together across differences in politics, age, background and beliefs. Participation affirms, in a way, the right of others to think differently and still be a part of the same community. This is what makes School of Ranch special, and, ultimately, is also what truly makes America great: the recognition that the price of our own freedom is that we must let others be free too—even when we think they're wrong. Thank you all for participating in School of Ranch and giving life to this essential truth.

Speaking of truth...we have some awesome new stuff for you, and that's a fact! The most exciting thing to me, being a geek, is the introduction of AI-based planning tools I developed into our workshops, starting with our Solar Systems, Weed Management, and Irrigation workshops. Participants will go home with a custom plan that addresses their specific needs. 


