### A Message from Pastor Paul Forrey

I am both impressed and immensely thankful for the progress the Monday Men, in partnership with the Trustees, have made on the downstairs renovation project so far in 2022. The June-July issue of this newsletter included some photos of their progress. If you have not walked through the downstairs spaces in some time, please feel free to do so and see how the project is taking shape.

- ✓ Classrooms are nearly finished.
- ✓ Painting throughout the rooms has steadily progressed.
- ✓ New ceiling tile and lights are installed. The wiring for Fellowship Hall lighting is redesigned so that it's much easier than it previously was to turn on all the lights.
- ✓ Transformation of the kitchen has already begun.
- ✓ Closet space has been created for the custodian and Faith Formation teachers.
- ✓ New cabinetry is installed in several rooms.
- ✓ A new rug is installed in one of the classrooms.

The work continues, of course. An overhaul of the hallway bathrooms is coming, as well as further work in the kitchen. Finally, a rug will be installed throughout Fellowship Hall and the hallways.

Please be sure to see the progress for yourself, and let's thank each person who's been working on the project. Many of them have been coming several days per week for months to increase the rate of progress. On top of that, the volunteers have been mindful of how the downstairs spaces are currently in use and have worked hard to ensure the spaces are operational, even if work in those spaces is still incomplete.

We praise God in Christ for the determination of each person working on the project, and for commitment among them to the life and ministries of our congregation.

All you need is to download the FREE Breeze app to your device from the Google Play Store or the Apple App Store, enter your username and password, and there you go—a full church directory.

Need to know someone's address? It's right there and clicking on it will open that address in your phone's default maps app! Want to phone someone? Clicking on the phone number (home phone or mobile phone) will automatically cause your phone to dial that number. Need to know someone's email address? Yep, that's right there in Breeze, too! In fact, you can click on that email address and quickly send an email right through the Breeze system from your own email address. Wow!

Do you need some help downloading the Breeze app to your phone or tablet, and need help getting it set up? Want to know how to access Breeze from your computer? We can help! 

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – May 10, 2022

PRESENT: President - Claudia Chalk, Vice President – Mark Vogt; Recording Secretary - Janet Van Nevel; Financial Secretary - Jeff Enyart; Worship Team - Debbie Yeager; Development - Cammy Burling; Missions - Sarah Lester; Trustees - Sally McNichols; Faith Formation - Amity Kukla; Tech Support - Craig McAlpin; Staff Parish Team – Jeanne Greiser, Pastor Paul Forrey.

Claudia called the meeting to order, over Zoom. She opened the meeting with a prayer and read the Council Covenant.

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT: No changes to April minutes. Motion made by Debbie and seconded by Cammy to approve minutes. Approved.
2. TREASURER'S REPORT: Jeff gave a summary of Sandy's report. We have \$36,174 in the checking account and \$33,371 in the temporary account. Mark motioned to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills, Sarah seconded. Motion passed.
3. FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Jeff reported there is an immediate opening for another counter to replace Pat Schuchter. They are planning to conclude the 2021 this week and report results on Saturday. April giving was \$13,271. Our year-to-date monthly giving is \$15,787. This is an increase over the past few years.
4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Claudia informed that Zac Dietz's Eagle Scout Court of Honor will be June 12<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm at St. Mary's Undercroft. Zac's Eagle Scout project was building the Labrinth at the cemetery. Claudia thanked everyone who brought food for the Easter Breakfast. It worked out well. She suggested we plan an outing to a Florence Y'all baseball game. Traditionally we've gone for Friday Night Fireworks games. Friday July 29<sup>th</sup> was selected.
5. VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mark reported that the Development Committee met on March 19<sup>th</sup>. They reviewed the purpose of the committee; to protect investments and provide funds to cover operational shortfalls and building and grounds projects. They are entrusted to enhance the value of the funds. They are meeting Saturday to review the portfolio and financial audit results. They are working with an advisor from Morgan Stanley.

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- a. Staff Parish Committee - Jeanne Greiser was welcomed as a new member of council. The committee members will rotate attending council meetings. Council emails will be sent to Jeanne, and she will forward to whoever is attending that month.
  - b. Missions – Sarah reported that the backpacks have been delivered, our next Family Promise rotation is the first weekend of June. Coffee, Cakes and Caring is scheduled for June 11<sup>th</sup> with Brighton Center's Women's Recovery Center.
  - c. Worship – Debbie thanked Mindy and Sally for getting the Mother's Day flowers. The Trustees have a plan to remove the front pews.
  - d. Trustees – Sally reported they will make a request for help moving the pews upstairs once they decide when to do it. Monday Men will have them disconnected so that they just need to be moved upstairs. There is a safety issue with the steps facing Jefferson Street, the railing is rusted through and no longer connected. The stairs opening to the parking lot need to have the railing replaced and the cracks in the landing repaired. The stairs toward the Parish House are safe and usable but need some major work. They are looking into contractor. New railings that would be up to code and match the Parish House.
  - e. Faith Formation – Amity reported that plans have been made for Confirmation on June 5<sup>th</sup> and honoring the Graduates on June 12<sup>th</sup>. They are looking for Sunday School aids and will be looking for volunteers for Vacation Bible School.
  - f. Tech Support - Craig shared the average # online view. Children's Chats have the most views.
7. CONSTITUTION: Sarah reported on the Constitution revision. The Draft was reviewed, it is a start but will need some minor tweaking as we work on the bylaws. Motion was made by Sarah and seconded by Mark to approve this as our working draft. Motion approved. The next step will be to revise the Bylaws. The various teams have already created they purpose statements. It was decided to put together a Bylaws Task Force. They would meet monthly. We will need participation from all the teams. It was decided to begin by asking people to serve on the Task Force.
8. ADJOURNMENT: Motion made by Sally and seconded by Amity to adjourn meeting. Motion passed.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – June 14, 2022

PRESENT: President - Claudia Chalk, Vice President – Mark Vogt; Recording Secretary - Janet Van Nevel; Financial Secretary - Jeff Enyart; Development - Cammy Burling; Faith In Action - Sarah Lester; Trustees - Sally McNichols; Faith Formation – Evelyn Dietz; Tech Support - Craig McAlpin; Staff Parish – Jeanne Greiser, Pastor Paul Forrey.

Claudia called the meeting to order, over Zoom. She opened the meeting with a prayer and read the Council Covenant.

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT: Sarah requested that we use the name Faith in Action instead of Missions in future minutes. Motion made by Sarah and seconded by Cammy to approve minutes. Motion carried.
2. TREASURER'S REPORT: Claudia gave a summary of Sandy's report. We have \$30,663 in the checking account and \$33,372 in the temporary account. So far we've spent \$17,053 on the lower level renovation with an additional \$4,926 pending for carpet. We still have \$8,021 remaining from the

\$30,000 we transferred from the investment account, plus \$3,078 in the temporary account allocated for renovation; for a total of \$11,099 left for the renovation. Jeff motioned to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills, Mark seconded. Motion passed.

3. FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Jeff reported that Lila Losey will be added to the counting schedule beginning in August. May giving was \$12,666. Our year-to-date monthly average is \$15,162. We're on target to meet budget with just a little help from our investments. The 2021 Annual Audit was completed. Giving statements to individual givers will be available upon request. Invoices should be approved by the appropriate committee chair before being given to Sandy for payment.
4. COMMITTEE REPORTS:
  - a. Team Reports were reviewed by Council prior to meeting. Motion made by Mark and seconded by Jeff to accept committee reports.
  - b. Faith in Action – Sarah reported they are looking at a possible Mission Weekend, probably with Matthew 25. Motion to approve made by Cammy, seconded by Claudia. Motion approved.
  - c. Faith Formation – Evelyn reported that all the volunteer spots for Vacation Bible School are covered. They are very excited to see the kids in person.
  - d. Pastor's Report – Paul reported that Shawn Hayslette has applied to be a Honor Flight Ambassador. If selected his fee to participate is \$600. Shawn has requested permission for request donations. Claudia moved and Sally seconded to grant permission to request donations if he's selected. Motion approved.
  - e. Trustees – Sally reported the water heater needs to be replace. Roger is taking care of it. Cost is approximately \$500. They would like to have a dinner to celebrate the basement renovations when completed
5. VICE PRESIDENT – Mark thanked Jeff for a very efficient internal audit. Are investments are continuing to collect dividends even though the market is down. They are looking to increase the interest on cash.
6. PRESIDENT – Claudia will notify committee chairs when reports are due to Darlene for the newsletter. It's usually the beginning of the third week of the month.
7. ADJOURNMENT: Motion made by Sally and seconded by Evelyn to adjourn meeting. motion passed. Next meeting will be July 12<sup>th</sup>.
