Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday; Time to reflect and share our thanks, for this is the time that we remember the greatest sacrifice.

A Message from Pastor Paul Forrey

This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 22. We will honor this religious ceremony with a service at 7:00pm. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the 40-day church season of Lent.

Historically, Lent is a period of personal reflection and penitence.

During the moving Ash Wednesday ceremony, the ashes—from which Ash Wednesday gets its name—were placed on the foreheads of the faithful with the words from Genesis: *“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”* While this service was widely used after the seventh century, there is evidence that such a service originated in the sixth century and was at first confined to people doing penance for grave sin. Clergy would comfort and encourage penitents by submitting themselves to the same public contrition.

Today the Ash Wednesday service is used for all people to reconnect our need for Christ and the forgiveness that Christ offers. Very often the service provides periods of extended silence for personal prayers and reflection. The point is not merely that we apologize to God for the sins we have committed, but that we recommit ourselves to transformed living. As mortal humans, we sin. We fall short of the lives to which God calls us. That’s the penitence part. But in Christ, we have been raised up into new people, reconnected with the divine within, so Christ empowers us to live in new ways, freed from the sinfulness and temptations that previously held us captive. The Ash Wednesday service offers us the opportunity to publicly make that commitment to transformed living.

I hope you will join us for the Ash Wednesday Service on February 22!

Lent 2023 Message Series

The Gospel of John

During the season of Lent, we will progress through the Gospel of John. John's gospel is unique among the four New Testament accounts of Jesus' life. Many of the stories that appear in Matthew, Mark, and Luke do not appear in John. John includes quite a few stories that do not appear in the other gospels. Where the first three gospels are primarily concerned with the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurates, John is primarily concerned with who Jesus is—the light and love of God—and what our active belief in Christ achieves for us.

We will explore the major themes in John's gospel through our series, and each week I will ask you to read portions of the book for the following Sunday. My hope is that this series will move each of us into a deeper reflection into who Jesus is *for us*, and what his continuing presence achieves in our lives.

After completing the program, families find themselves alone in low-income housing 🏠. Continuing the Promise supports families on their way to stability after experiencing homelessness.

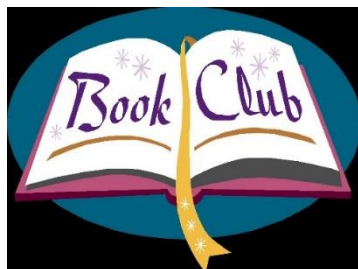

What is the Backpack Program?

The Backpack Program provides weekend food for Campbell County students who may go hungry on the weekends when they are not in school.

Every school in the Campbell County School District has churches supporting this program. We all take turns to make sure these kids (who are carefully chosen by the school's Family Resource Center Coordinator) are fed each weekend.



St. Paul's UCC has provided food for Campbell Ridge Elementary students each May since 2011!

We collect donations each Superbowl Sunday by "voting" who will win the Superbowl with our donations.

The goal is to provide kid-friendly, easy-to-make breakfast, lunch, and snack items for each Saturday and Sunday.

Last year we were able to put 9 food items in each “backpack” for the weekend and spent \$957.18 on 256 “backpacks” of food.

St. Paul’s youth and kids will pack up the food on Sunday morning April 30 and a member of the Faith Formation Team will deliver the food to Campbell Ridge. This is a chance for our kids to help other kids in our area.



Donations will be collected February 12 at the beginning of worship.

Council met in the Parish House with a meal. Claudia called meeting to order. Paul let the group in prayer. Council recited the Council Covenant. Claudia welcomed Julie Behymer to Council as the incoming Recording Secretary.

1. RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Motion made by Cammy and 2nd by Julie to approve November 2022 Council Meeting Minutes as presented.
2. TREASURER'S REPORT: Claudia reported for Sandy. The current checking balance is \$41,443.98 with \$11,315.03 in outstanding checks for an available balance of \$30,128.95. The balance in the temporary account at Truist Bank is \$200.10. Renovation expenses through November were \$40,168.66. Renovation checks issued in December to date total \$12,391.31 for an annual total of \$52,560.02. Sandy needs to know where to send the checks for the Christian Appalachian Project (\$700) and Heartland Conference (\$815) donations. Sarah will send her the information. Motion made by Evelyn and seconded by Debbie to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed.
3. FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Claudia thanked Jeff for his 12 years on Council. Jeff reported November was a good month for donations (\$14,182). YYD giving was \$144,613. December is typically a good month. Forecast for annual giving to be \$161K to \$165K; forecasted operating expenses are \$180K to \$187K; projected shortfall is \$19K to \$26K. 2023 budget was approved by congregation on 12/11/22. Giving statements are planned to be available on 1/15/23. Jeff and Janet met regarding the transition of Financial Secretary responsibilities.
4. APPROVAL OF TEAMS' WRITTEN REPORTS: There were no questions regarding the Teams' written reports. Debbie motioned to approve the written reports as posted and Sarah seconded. Motion approved.
5. FAITH IN ACTION: Sarah reported the White Gift pickup for the families is Thursday, December 22nd from 4:00 – 6:00. Gift sorting will be Monday, the 19th at 2:00 pm, kids will be here on 12/22 at 9:00 am to sort the food. Every family will receive gifts, food and household supplies. Canned food was collected through a drive at Cline Elementary.
6. FAITH FORMATION: Evelyn reported they will get together in January to plan out the year.
7. DEVELOPMENT – Cammy reported the "Thank You" letter to go along with the giving statements has been updated.
8. PRESIDENTS REPORT: Claudia would like to schedule a Council Retreat to plan for 2023. She would like each committee to "Tell Their Story". Retreat scheduled for February 11th at 9:30 am at Charlene Rogers'. Breakfast will be served.
9. Next council meeting is Tuesday, January 10th at 7:00 pm by Zoom.

Cammy motioned to adjourn, Jeff seconded, motion carried.
