### Confirmation in the Life of the Church

A Message from Pastor Paul Forrey

September 2021 marks the beginning of a new confirmation class. Five young men will embark on the confirmation journey of learning and discovery this year. I ask all us to reflect on both the history of confirmation and how it is best lived out in the life of the church today.

The earliest generations of Christians were baptized as adults. Catechesis—education and faith formation—was offered as a preparation for baptism when people would affirm their faith. Over the centuries as infant baptism became widely practiced, catechesis was offered to young adults to prepare them to confirm the commitments made for them at their baptism so they could then take their place as full members of the church.

Confirmation has taken many forms. Many of us experienced confirmation as a long (and sometimes grueling) experience during which we were required to memorize information. Some may have been required to provide the correct answers certain questions of faith and doctrine. Others experienced confirmation as a mentorship during which adult church members guided young people into church membership.

Confirmation continues to evolve today. Let's think of the confirmation experience five young people will begin this month as a journey that began long ago and will continue beyond Confirmation Sunday next summer. We are guiding these learners to see themselves and their lives in terms of discipleship. Discipleship is a life-long journey during which we enter into the larger story of all that God has been and is doing in the world. Rarely is there ever one "correct answer" along that journey; God prefers to walk with us into the mysteries of human life and into the mysteries of God's life.

Young people in confirmation this year will learn about the Bible, God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and about the church and our sacred practices. Memorizing information is not the primary goal, however. We are more concerned that our young people come to understand themselves as vital participants in the grand story of what God is up to in the world today and in the grand story of what God is doing in and through our congregation. All that we will teach them will provide them with resources to nurture their relationship with God and with the church that lives in Christ's name. Our focus is lead them to *learn about* God so that they can *know God personally* and lead our church into future expressions of God's power and presence.

Please pray regularly for Camren, Greyson, Jack, Jackson, and Logan in the time to come. Offer them the gift of your Christian companionship and mentorship. Share with them your

faith experiences, and validate theirs. Invite them to participate actively in the work of your leadership team. Recognize and honor the gifts they are already sharing with us. Welcome them as they take on new ministries in the life of our church.

We thank God for our congregation's young people and for the gifts that they share with us.

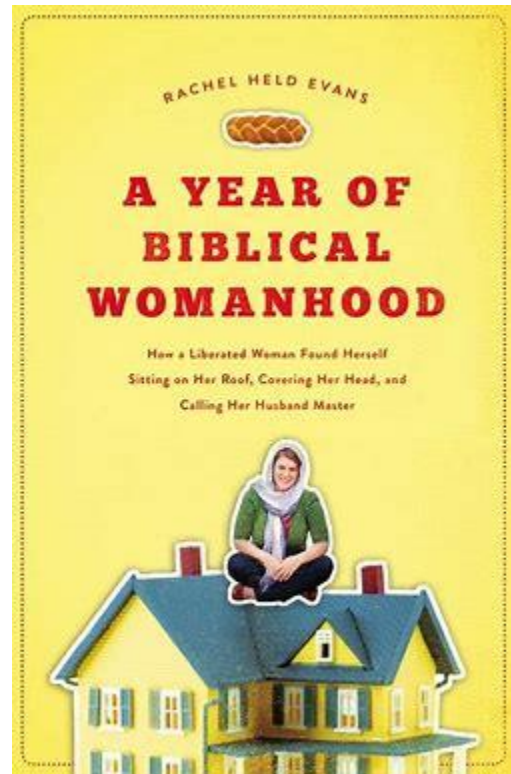

(Development)-Cammy Burling, Worship/Ministry-Melinda Schamer, Trustees-Roger Von Strohe, Tech Support-Craig McAlpin, Pastor Paul Forrey.

Charlene opened the meeting with a prayer and Council recited the Council Covenant.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) SECRETARY'S REPORT— Cammy Burling made a motion to accept the May Council meeting minutes as posted to OneDrive. Claudia seconded and the motion carried.
- 2) TREASURER'S REPORT—Jeff Enyart moved to accept the report as posted on OneDrive and pay the bills. Melinda Schamer seconded and the motion carried.
- 3) FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT-Jeff reported:
  - June 6, 2021 giving summary--\$4,036.17 (operating budget) and \$7,000.00 (media system).
  - Breeze update: An option has been added for the donor to cover the transaction fee.
  - Shared 3 year comparison to date graph
  - A line for media system donations can be added to Breeze.
  - Capital Projects Update: Shared a bar graph showing the donations vs investment fund for media system. Also using volunteers will keep the cost down on the lower-level renovations.
- 4) TECH REPORT-Craig reported that Sandy Smith needs a new laptop in order to continue doing her job as treasurer. The cost would be \$450.00. After a discussion, it was determined that this is an emergency situation. Jeff made a motion to purchase a new laptop for Sandy. Cammy Burling seconded and the motion carried. Craig will try to rebuild the old computer so that it can be used for other purposes.
- 5) PASTOR'S REPORT-- Paul urged us all to remember our priority discussed to re-engage our congregation which was discussed in January. At some point we need to grow our congregation but coming out of the pandemic, it is important to reach out to our members who have not come back to services.
- 6) CE BOARD (Faith Formation)—Amity reported:
  - A talent show is planned for Friday, July 16. Kona Ice truck will be there before the show.
  - Children's Chats are still being recorded. They need volunteers.
- 7) MISSION (Faith in Action)—Sarah reported:
  - The team is still waiting for volunteer opportunities to open up after the pandemic.
  - There is a receptacle in church for the empty pill bottles.
- 8) STEWARDSHIP (Development Ministry)—Cammy reported:
  - The Snappy Tomato Pizza fundraiser made \$268.00. They are looking at other fundraising opportunities.
  - They are going to provide a flyer and an envelope at church services for donations for the media system.
  - They continue to plan for the Your Church Our Future event. Hoping to have that event in the fall.
- 9) TRUSTEES—Roger reported:
  - The radiator in the choir room has been repaired. During the repairs, they noticed that it's falling off the wall in the restroom and library. It's been secured and won't have to be replaced at this time.
  - Air conditioning and furnace in the parish house has finally come to the point where it needs to be replaced.
  - Roger contacted ICB to tell them the media system project has been approved. He asked them about a timeline. It looks like we are looking at 6-8 to start the project at best. We will be asked to make a \$5,000.00 deposit, with a larger payment to cover cost of the materials after they are delivered.
  - He suggests we add a category to the budget (in the future) to cover administrative costs.
- 10) WORSHIP/MINISTRY—Melinda reported:
  - The team has been discussing when we can return to one service, when COVID restrictions can be lifted and when we can resume passing communion plates.
  - After a discussion of these items, Melinda made a motion to return to one service at 10:00 beginning on July 4, 2021. Claudia seconded and the motion carried.
  - Melinda made a motion that masks and physical distancing no longer be required at services, but masks are strongly recommended for unvaccinated people and those with immunodeficiencies. Claudia seconded and the motion carried.
- 11) VICE-PRESIDENT---Claudia reported that Melinda will be on vacation on June 27. Mindy Connell has agreed to sub and also subbed on May 23. A discussion was held on paying her to sub. Sandy will check on the amount and who is responsible for signing the purchase request.
- 12) PRESIDENT'S REPORT—No report.

#### OTHER BUSINESS:

- 1) Sandy received a letter from Washington UCC asking us to send our quarterly donation directly to them instead of going through SONKA. There has been a transition in bookkeeping at SONKA and our donation was delayed. Paul will contact SONKA to get clarity.
- 2) Cammy Burling made a motion that we support the Fair Board by making a \$100.00 Friend of the Fair donation. Sarah seconded and the motion carried. This cost will be absorbed by the Development Team.
- 3) Sarah asked for Council's approval for the Wednesday night yoga class to advertise in a new Alexandria magazine. Council agreed.

Our next meeting will be held on July 13, 2021 at 7:00 via Zoom. The meeting was adjourned and Council prayed the Lord's Prayer.

PRESENT: President- Charlene Rogers, Vice President-Claudia Chalk, Financial Secretary-Jeff Enyart, Recording Secretary and Worship/Ministry-Debbie Yeager, C.E. (Faith Formation) -Amity Kukla, Stewardship (Development)-Cammy Burling, Trustees-Sally McNichols, Tech Support-Craig McAlpin, Pastor Paul Forrey.

Charlene opened the meeting with a prayer.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) SECRETARY'S REPORT— Sally McNichols made a motion to accept the June Council meeting minutes as posted to OneDrive. Claudia seconded and the motion carried.
- 2) TREASURER'S REPORT— Temporary account=\$19,699.65; Checking account=\$25,406.59; Media system donations=\$15,228.18; Eagle Scout project=\$412. Cammy Burling moved to accept the report and pay the bills. Jeff Enyart seconded and the motion carried.
- 3) FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT-Jeff reported:
  - July giving for first 2 Sundays---\$6,769.14 (operating budget) and \$9,884.14 (total)
  - June 2021 below average but with total giving up.
  - Operating budget giving is up 2.2 percent.
  - There has been phenomenal support for the Media System.
  - Capital Projects Update: By using more volunteer labor, we hope to keep the cost of the first floor renovation down.
- 4) TECH REPORT-Craig reported that he is working on setting up Sandy's laptop. He also added a page about the labyrinth to the church's website.
- 5) PASTOR'S REPORT-- Paul emphasized his gratitude to the leadership teams for their continued efforts to re-engage the congregation. This needs to remain our top priority this year.
- 6) CE (Faith Formation)
  - The talent show is planned for Friday, July 16. Rain date is Saturday, July 24.
  - There have been a few more people volunteer to be aides for Sunday School.
  - Children's Chats are still being recorded. They need volunteers. Claudia asked church leaders to consider doing a children's chat.
- 7) MISSION (Faith in Action)—Paul reported:
  - The team is developing relationships with new partner organizations.
  - The response to the team's efforts during Mental Health Month was very positive. The team is working on more projects year-round to bring awareness to the congregation.
  - Charlene mentioned that members will be serving at the soup kitchen on Sat., July 17.
- 8) STEWARDSHIP (Development Ministry)—Cammy reported:
  - They consolidated envelope numbers and eliminated 40.
  - They continue to plan for the Your Church Our Future event. They need questions from other leadership teams by August 1.
- 9) TRUSTEES—Sally reported:
  - The ceiling is being replaced in the large Sunday School room.



- They have been power-washing the buildings. There is a section in the back of the church that does not get sun and is too high for the trustees to get to, so it may need to be done by professionals.
  - The rose bushes by the parish house are diseased and need to be removed. Sally will plant something else.
  - They are getting bids on replacing the HVAC unit in the Parish House.
  - A window in the large classroom needs to be replaced. This will cost around \$300 and will be part of the renovation.
- Charlene brought up a conversation she's had with Roger about Coffee Hour. After a discussion Council agreed to have coffee in the library at 9:15. We will add donuts on August 1.

10) WORSHIP/MINISTRY—Debbie reported:

- We will return to passing the communion plates as of Sunday, Aug. 1.
- We would like to recruit some new members for our team.

11) VICE-PRESIDENT---Claudia reported that she will meet with Ben to discuss the best way to set up the tables in Fellowship Hall for Sunday School.

12) PRESIDENT'S REPORT—Charlene said that she has been asked if we are going to do a new pictorial directory. After a discussion, it was determined that we will not. We will encourage people to make better use of Breeze. Charlene and Craig will work on an article for the next newsletter and a printed page of directions to help people access Breeze. There is an updated non-pictorial directory in the back of church.

OTHER BUSINESS:

- Postage will be going up on Aug. 1. After a discussion, it was decided to just have Darlene continue to buy a roll of stamps when needed.
- Charlene and Claudia will form a nominating committee to fill the positions of Vice President and Recording Secretary for next year. The leadership teams will provide a list of their members to the nominating committee.
- We will have a Recruitment Sunday during the service on Sunday, August, 29. Each team will make a 5-minute presentation explaining the functions of their team and the advantages to being an active part of their work. Team members will be available after the service to answer questions. Claudia will get refreshments for after the service.

Our next meeting will be held on August 10, 2021 at 7:00 via Zoom. Sally McNichols motioned to adjourn the meeting. Jeff Enyart seconded and the motion carried. Council prayed the Lord's Prayer.
