Overview and Objectives:

Approximately thirty percent of human trafficking victims will encounter an Emergency Medicine (EM) professional during their time of enslavement, unfortunately none of them are freed as a result of their encounter. Emergency medicine professionals play a key role in recognizing the signs that a patient is being victimized by human trafficking and are afforded a unique window of opportunity by which to offer help. This comprehensive educational program will focus on the pre-hospital and hospital encounters in an effort to elevate the knowledge base of EM professionals, allowing for proper identification and subsequent intervention. Providing EM professionals with the tools to understand the wide-ranging problem of trafficking, including when and how to act, can lead to the freedom of many of those currently enslaved.

Upon completion of this program participants will be able to:

- Define human trafficking
- Identify people susceptible to trafficking
- Describe the signs and symptoms of trafficked persons presenting for medical evaluation
- Describe situational indicators of trafficking
- Describe how and when to approach a victim of human trafficking
- Recognize guidelines for evaluation of a potential trafficking victim
- Recognize guidelines for response to an identified human trafficking victim
- Compare and contrast victims of human trafficking and domestic violence
- Review existing screening/assessment tools for identifying a human trafficking victim
