

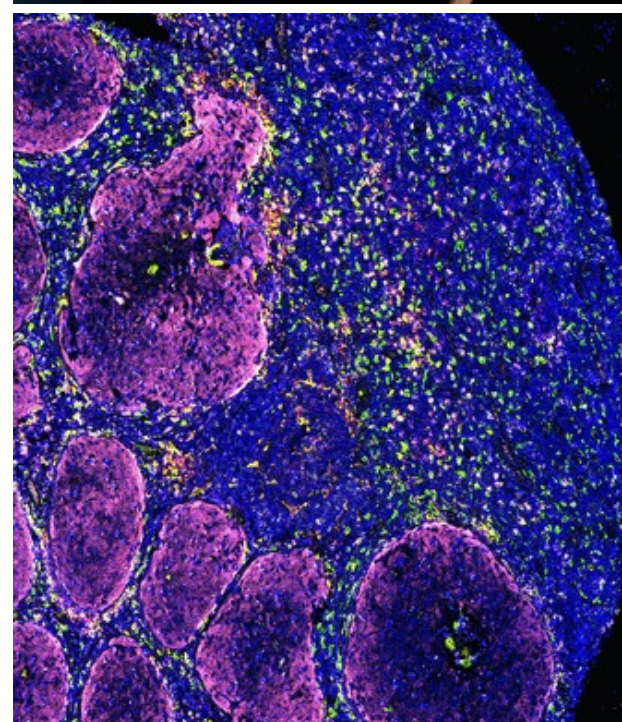

What is the AAI Research Advocacy Program (RAP)?

The RAP provides non-scientist policy leaders from patient advocacy and other health and scientific organizations with the opportunity to learn about immunology and how the immune system affects the diseases or conditions of concern to them.

Designed for the general public, the program features a series of talks by AAI-member scientists who are engaged in cutting-edge immunological research and who help participants understand the role of the immune system in preventing, causing, and treating disease.

What topics will this year's program cover?

Speakers will address infectious diseases, cancer/immunotherapy, autoimmune diseases/allergies, inflammation, neuroimmunology, transplantation, vaccines, and other areas of participant interest.

Where will the program be held?

The RAP will be held at the AAI office at 1451 Rockville Pike, Suite 650, Rockville, MD 20852. The nearest Metro stop (a 10-15 minute walk) is Twinbrook. Parking is available at 1401 Rockville Pike for a cost of \$6.00.
