Quotes of the Week

“God who did not go to the seminary or study theology will repay you abundantly.”

Pope Francis, in a letter to Sister Mónica Astorga Cremona, a Discalced Carmelite nun in Argentina who raised funds for an apartment building that will serve as permanent housing for twelve transgender people who are currently in poverty. “Pope tells nun helping transgender women, ‘God will repay you.’” *Crux*. August 18, 2020.

“According to the latest report from the Multimedia Catholic Center, 81 priests and religious have died in Mexico after contracting the COVID-19 coronavirus since March. The number includes 70 priests, six deacons and five religious, most of whom were from the archdioceses of San Luis Potosi, Morelia and Puebla. Most of the priests who died were actively working in parishes and churches across the country, with ages ranging from 39 to 85.”

“Over 80 clergy and religious in Mexico have died of Covid-19.” *Crux*. August 18, 2020.

“The Catholic Church teaches that voting requires an informed conscience, the need to evaluate a candidate’s character and the prudence to apply moral principles to a complex world with imperfect choices. Perhaps the most authentically Catholic thing for Catholic voters to do in November is tune out the partisan noise and draw guidance from that rich theological tradition.”

“It’s not just about abortion: What ‘pro-life’ means for Catholics in the 2020 election.” *Washington Post*. August 17, 2020.

“Priests in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe have been warned that they could lose the faculty to preach if they give homilies longer than five minutes. The archdiocese told CNA the restriction is part of the archdiocesan response to the coronavirus pandemic. In the memo, sent July 31, archdiocesan vicar general Fr. Glennon Jones said that the archdiocesan chancery had ‘received reports of some homilies going on for well over the 5-minute limit set by the Archbishop.’

“This not only increases exposure time of the coronavirus to others, but increases the discomfiture of many congregants, to the point of some not attending Mass because of it.”

“Citing COVID, Santa Fe warns of preaching suspensions for homilies over 5 minute limit.” *National Catholic Register*. August 18, 2020.

“As of late last month... almost 20% of Americans with kids at home couldn’t afford to give their kids enough food, up from almost 17% in early June.”

“More Americans go hungry amid coronavirus pandemic, census shows.” *Wall Street Journal*. August 16, 2020.

“Covid is now the No. 3 cause of death in the US – ahead of accidents, injuries, lung disease, diabetes, Alzheimer’s, and many, many other causes,’ said Dr. Thomas Frieden, a former director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Heart disease and cancer are the leading causes of death in the US, according to the CDC. The rate of deaths from Covid-19 is also much greater in the US than in many other countries, Frieden said. ‘Last week, Americans were eight times more likely to get killed by Covid than were Europeans,’ he said.”

“Covid-19 is now the No. 3 cause of death in the US. But testing to find and isolate cases has dropped off.” *CNN*. August 17, 2020.

“We will not stand for this type of destruction and violence in our community. Rest assured, the FBI will continue to work with the Providence Police Department and our law enforcement partners to apprehend and charge those who engaged in violent crime under the cover of peaceful protests.”

Joseph Bonavolonta, special agent in charge of the FBI Boston Division, in a statement following the arrest of a man who set fire to a Providence Police cruiser during a coordinated attack on the city of Providence on June 2, when 8-10 police officers were injured and 65 people were arrested. “Man charged with lighting Providence police cruiser on fire during riot: U.S. Attorney.” *Boston Herald*. August 17, 2020.

“Study authors reveal people who eat [moderate amounts of] chocolate at least once a week have an eight-percent lower risk of coronary artery disease compared to participants who eat chocolate less frequently.”

“Sweet! Eating chocolate is good for your heart, blood vessels.” *StudyFinds.org*. August 14, 2020. According to the study, recently published in the *European Journal of Preventive Cardiology*, “Clinical trials have shown that the consumption of chocolate has favorable effects on blood pressure and endothelial function... [Our] analysis suggests that the consumption of chocolates at least once a week is associated with a reduction in the risk of CAD [coronary artery disease].”



REFLECTION

The only way to know God is to love God. Our minds will never fully grasp the mystery of God, but our hearts and souls can learn to love the mystery. Years ago, when life had a more innocent quality to it, we believed what we were told or witnessed, unless there was direct evidence otherwise. This was especially true if the information came from someone in authority. In a sense, we were a bit more gullible on one hand but also more trusting on the other. The latter is an admirable quality that sadly can be eroded when we realize we have been duped. With education and technological advances, we find ourselves more skeptical and less likely to too quickly accept and believe what we see and hear.

For all of the good that social media can do, it can also easily distort reality and truth. Photoshop and a myriad other technological truths can add to, fabricate, and make even the non-existent seem real. It is amazing. How far do we allow this obviously justifiable skepticism to take us? Questioning and doubting are healthy elements of any good relationship as long as we don't allow them to turn us away from a deeper experience of love and encounter. If we cannot get our minds around something or empirically justify or prove it, we tend to declare it a hoax, untrue, or unauthentic and walk away. The very same trust that can quickly be eroded is exactly what is essential for all of our relationships, especially our relationship with God. With all things and people that make a profound claim on us, we have to trust in the absence of knowledge. Full self-investment involves plunging completely into the unknown!

Simon Peter said to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter came to this knowledge, which is not "head knowledge" because of the relationship he shared with Jesus and what God was able to reveal in and through that relationship. Peter simply "knew" because of love that this is who Jesus really is. The silent exchange of love between friends, and not an intellectual exercise of the mind, brought Peter to this place. When we stop and think about it, there are many things in life that we simply know but do not completely understand. When someone sacrifices their own well-being for another, it may not make intellectual sense when examined. But it makes a world of sense when it is carried out. The vastness of reality and an encounter with incomprehensible mystery all lead us to profound silence where we simply know something to be true. Have you trusted enough to allow your relationship with God to bring you to this place or are you still too skeptical?

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

To stand in the presence of God is to stand in the presence of incomprehensible mystery. We are people of proofs and facts. With good reason, we are becoming more doubtful of what presents itself to us, as technology makes it easy to fabricate false images and distort what is actually true. What we think is real actually may not be. To have faith in God means that we must be willing to trust in the absence of full knowledge. To know the mind of God means we would know God himself, and that is impossible. To acknowledge Jesus as the Christ means we acknowledge that the reality and presence of an incarnate God has a fundamental claim on who we are. When we name this truth, we participate in a depth of knowledge that stretches us far beyond the scope of our minds. It brings us to silence, which is the only way to touch our soul.


