BETTER KNOW A SAINT!

MARGARET OF ANTIOCH



Nothing certain is known of her, but according to her untrustworthy legend, she was the daughter of a pagan priest at Antioch in Pisidia. Also known as Marina, she was converted to Christianity, whereupon she was driven from home by her father. She became a shepherdess and when she spurned the advances of Olybrius, the prefect, who was infatuated with her beauty, he charged her with being a Christian. He had her tortured and then imprisoned, and while she was in prison she had an encounter with the devil in the form of a dragon. According to the legend, he swallowed her, but the cross she carried in her hand so irritated his throat that he was forced to disgorge her (she is patroness of childbirth). The

next day, attempts were made to execute her by fire and then by drowning, but she was miraculously saved and converted thousands of spectators witnessing her ordeal-all of whom were promptly executed. Finally, she was beheaded. That she existed and was martyred are probably true; all else is probably fictitious embroidery and added to her story, which was immensely popular in the Middle Ages, spreading from the East all over Western Europe. She is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, and hers was one of the voices heard by Joan of Arc. Her feast day is July 20th.

THE YOUTH-LED SERVICE – AN UPDATE

There is lots to do, and we have been diving in! We are taking a three-pronged approach to exploring the question, “What is Church?”

First, there is Sunday School. Between the excellent curriculum for the middle-schoolers, and the more free-form seminar of the high-schoolers, we are getting a good grounding in what it means to be a Christian and an Episcopalian.

Second, youth group is where we focus more on what we will be doing at our service on May 12th. To that end, we have been having lots of discussions encompassing everything from common church architectural terms to a dissection of the Nicene Creed. And we have lots more ahead of us. Soon, we will be bringing in the Rev Peter and the Rev. Patti to help us untangle some questions and doubts. We will be actively engaging with the different Sunday morning ministries to discover the nuts and bolts of a service, and why people feel called to serve as they do.

Third is a serendipitous Girl Scout Gold Award project. A young parishioner of St. Andrew by the Bay has designed a project that entails youth from various churches on the Broadneck peninsula attending services at each other’s church (and temple). Next month we will get together for a Saturday mass and a potluck to discuss what we have observed from our visits, and what we think about it all. We are getting a good feel for how different denominations worship, and that helps us explore our own worship practices. This Friday evening, we will also participate in a Shabbat at Temple Beth Shalom in Arnold.

The intent is to help the Youth formulate their own answers to “What is Church?” Even more importantly, they will have the language and the context to think about this question for the rest of their lives. As they grow and mature, they will always have the tools they need to help them decide what Church means to them, and to help them be intentional in their worship. The answers they come up with will be unique, tailored to meet their individual needs, but they will all hopefully share a common understanding of how “Church” and worship can help keep us in touch with the love God has for each of us. It is an exciting journey!

AN URGENT APPEAL TO ALL ADULTS!

As a congregation, we are blessed with a wonderful problem. We have youth that are asking for **MORE** church, **MORE** youth group, **MORE** chances to become involved. Do you realize how blessed we are to have this problem? Job well done, parents! You got them here, and now they **WANT** to be here.

The challenge is now to **KEEP** them here.

This year is a very ambitious one for St. Margaret's youth. Everything we are doing this year is all aimed at May 12th. Why? Because the youth are going to completely plan and lead the 9 am service on that Mother's Day. There are tons of moving parts over the next year that need to come together to make this happen. We will be interacting with many of the church's ministries, we are going to be visiting other churches, and we will be doing a lot of thinking and discussing about what we do as the Episcopal Church, and why. All of this is layered on top of the regular Monday night meetings.

Additionally, I have had several youths tell me that their schedules this year preclude their coming on Monday nights, and they are asking for some way to participate. And beyond that, I was approached by several youths from other churches this summer complaining that their congregations were too small to permit a full-blown youth group and asked if they could join ours! I don't know about you, but when I have kids asking for more church, I can only respond with **YES**. So, I am going to try adding in a Sunday afternoon every month or so.

We have a chance to participate in two mission trips this summer, and each will require some sort of fundraising. Nightwatch is in less than two months. There will be the Warm Tree again this year. Light House dinners and Winter Relief meals. And on and on. There is so much available for our kids this year it is almost mind-boggling. The Holy Hotmail came out this past week, and it ran to 8 pages of information and calendar items. I already have additions to make.

To make all of this happen for our youth, I need your help. We have safety rules that dictate the ratio of adults to youth, so *nothing* can happen if it is just me showing up. As important as those rules are, I think it is equally important for our youth, our congregation, and ourselves that there is a large and diverse group of adults making the youth community broader and deeper.

What do I specifically need?

- I need at least one person each Monday night we have Faith & Fellowship. If you come for dinner beforehand, it is a two-hour commitment.
- I need probably two adults to help with the additional Sunday afternoon Youth Group (no more than once per month, for about three hours). Let's discuss this if you are interested. I have several thoughts.
- I need a chaperone (or two) who can come on Nightwatch (9-10 November) in NYC (I pay all chaperone expenses!)
- There are two Mondays in March (11-18) when I cannot be here, so I need two people for those two nights. I'll have everything planned and ready to go!

There are other things that crop up over the course of the year, but the list above is the **bare minimum** that I need to make our program work.

I am asking that you prayerfully consider your involvement with our youth. Can you commit to one Monday night a month? Would you like to come on Nightwatch? Can I call you when I have "volunteer emergency"? I know how busy everyone is. I know how tiring everyday life can be. I want to make this as easy for you as it is rewarding. Please contact me to discuss how you can be

part of this wonderful ministry. **AND**, please feel free to pass this on to someone else you feel would want to be part of things.


