- Backup, on-call support for individual shabbat services or social events
- Ushering for the High Holy Days
- Volunteering to join the "AHY Schleppers" when possible, for set up of the sanctuary, the vestry with the Ark, tables, chairs, prayerbooks etc.
- Greeter/Dispenser of Name tags at specific events
- Issuing acknowledgement/letters when donors request them
- Overseeing set up and clean up for Oneg Shabbats, Havdalah etc.
- Shopping for routinely used items eg. Wine, grape juice, cups, napkins etc.
- Making a limited number of phone calls when a need is identified
- Ambassador outreach to new and prospective members, by phone or meetup
- Offer to help with any specific Am HaYam event or activity, in person or otherwise

Am HaYam is very proud of its 30+ year tradition of not requiring dues and we would very much like this to continue. But in order for it to continue, we need more folks to volunteer their time, even if it is just once or for one period of time.
