

Bar Mitzvah

Is a Hebrew term meaning “son of the commandment”. Bar Mitzvah is a Jewish coming of age ritual for boys. According to Jewish law, when a Jewish boy is 13 years old, he becomes accountable for his actions and becomes a Bar Mitzvah. He has all the rights and obligations of a Jewish adult, including the commandments of the Torah.

The Torah

The Torah refers to the five books of Moses: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. It is the central and most important document of Judaism and has been used by Jews through the ages. The Torah scrolls are entirely handwritten in Hebrew by a sofer (scribe) on parchment from a kosher animal.

In Memory of Zigmund Adler

Rylan has chosen to honor and share his Bar Mitzvah with Zigmund Adler. Zigmund was born in Liege, Belgium on July 18, 1936. Zigmund's parents were Czechoslovakian Jews who had emigrated to Belgium. Zigmund, his aunt and two cousins were sent to the Mechelen internment camp, and then to Auschwitz, where 7-year old Zigmund was gassed on May 21, 1944.
