



Advising Considerations

Graduation Rate

The 6 year graduation rate of students attending the college.

Admissibility

Your students likelihood of being admitted based on their academic profile.

Affordability

A student and families ability to pay after all financial aid (scholarships and grants) is offered.



Advising Considerations

Start Early

- Educate on HBCUs
- Advise to build a strong profile
- Build healthy list of options

Plan

- Common App, Common Black College Application, Direct
- College application vs. College Scholarship applications
- Check email frequently for opportunities

Strategy

- Building a strong profile (academics, extra currics)
- SAT optional for admittance but *not* for scholarships
- Outside scholarships (DCCAP, Greek/Affinity Orgs)

On Campus

- Find support to maintain grades
- Get involved
- Seek opportunities on campus

Be Mindful

- Don't project experience when guiding student
- Letting go is difficult, summer support
