

Gimme String

How to Use

The string can be used to hole out a putt without counting a stroke. The string must be used before anyone puts.

Example 1:

If putting for birdie, and best putt of group is 3 inches short, if someone has a string 3 inches or longer, the string can be used and the score would be birdie. In other words, the string can be used as a gimme without counting the stroke. The string then gets shortened for future use.

Shortening the String

The length of the string to be used is measured from the center of the ball to the edge of the cup. Cut the length used and the remaining string can be saved for future use. If no scissor is available, either mark that length with a knot or a marker.

Example 2:

If you use 3 inches of the string to save par, and there were 10 inches of string, place the string on the green starting with the end (or previous mark) from the center of the ball to the edge of the hole. Tie a knot or make a mark or cut from the point at the edge of the hole which will be the new end of string. The team would only have 7 inches remaining.
