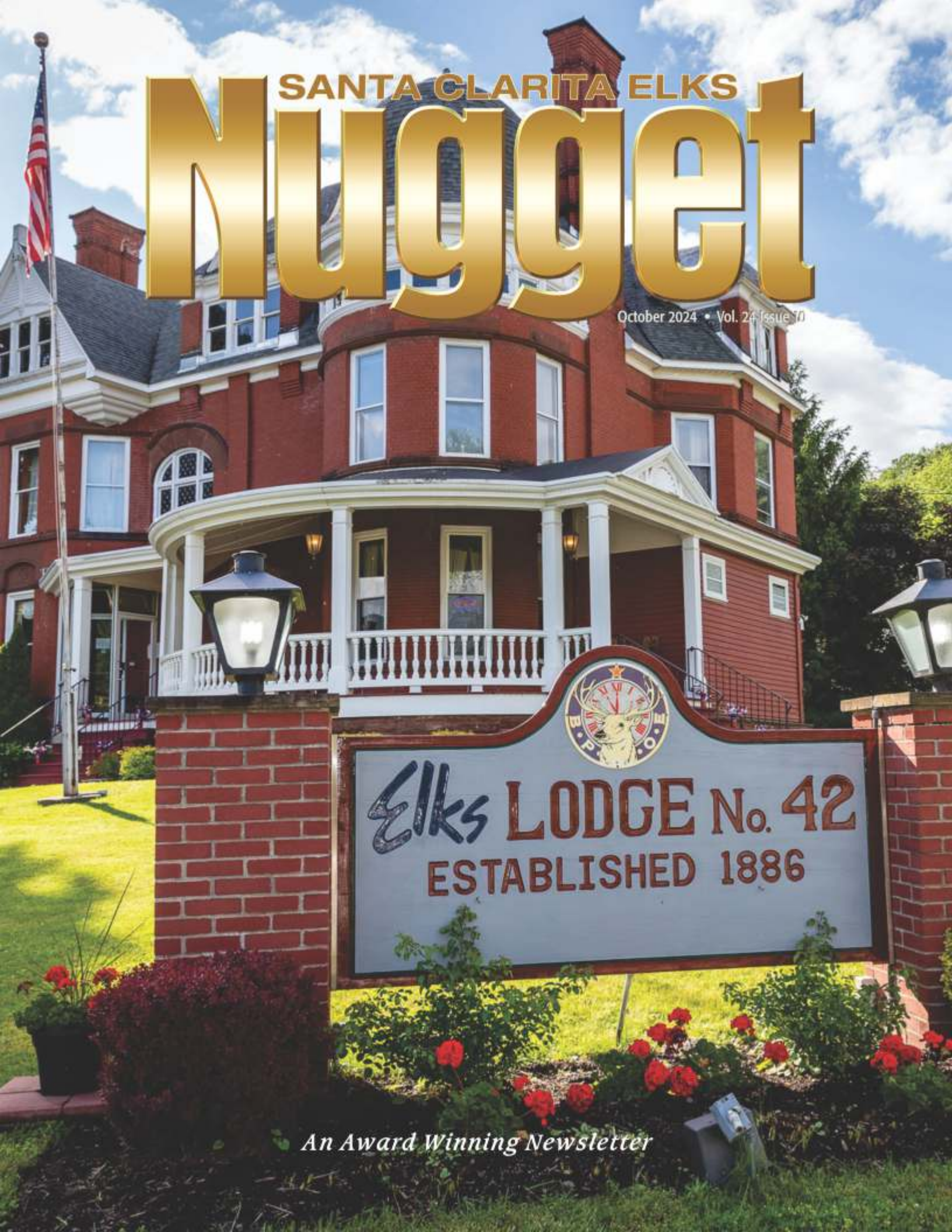

How ENF is helping California-Hawaii?

During the 2023-24 Lodge year, the Elks of California-Hawaii donated **\$1,199,510.92** to the Elks National Foundation. This year, the Foundation will give back the following:

State Charities Grant:	\$803,140.00
Special Projects Grant:	\$645,610.00
Bonus Grant:	\$182,670.00
Most Valuable Student:	\$304,000.00
Legacy Award:	\$92,000.00
National Veterans Service Commission:	\$55,140.00
Grand Total:	\$2,082,565.00

That's a ratio of 1.73 for every dollar the Foundation received from CHEA last year. That doesn't include the money Lodges in California-Hawaii will get back through our Community Investments Program. For the 2023-24 fiscal year, ENF awarded a total of \$1,041,520 to 129 CHEA Lodges.

A Message from the Leading Knight Mike Brandriff



Greetings Fellow Elks,

I hope all is well with you. I've finally returned from visiting my daughter in Montana. It was a terrific visit, but it's always nice to come home to family and friends. Since I've returned, I've hit the ground running with our Lodge.

I'm sure many of you are familiar with the Elks National Foundation (ENF). However, for those of you who may not be familiar with ENF, I'd like to enlighten you about this fantastic charitable program. In 1928, the Elks National President, John F. Malley, created the Elks National Foundation. It was his vision to create a program that would "unite the forces of the Order into a mighty army for the service of mankind." Mr. Malley's dream came true at the Grand Lodge Convention that year as the delegates voted to establish ENF with an initial \$100,000 grant. Today the ENF endowment fund is valued at \$823.3 million.

The mission of the ENF is to help Elks build stronger communities. This pledge is fulfilled by investing in communities where Elks live and work. Since its inception, the ENF has contributed more than \$500 million toward Elks Charitable projects nationwide. This year, the ENF allocated 16.3 million to fund the Community Investments Program. The Community Investments Program offers Lodges throughout the nation the opportunity to serve their community projects by allocating several types of Grants. Here are the Grants that are available to all Lodges:

- The Beacon Grant of \$4,000 is available to lead an active, charitable project
- The Spotlight Grant of \$2,000 is available to shine a light on important community issues
- The Gratitude Grant of \$2,000-\$4,000 is available to support local, charitable activities but it will only be allocated if the Lodge membership meets the threshold of the National Presidents per capita goal.
- The Impact Grant of \$10,000 is available to run a large-scale community service project. This Grant would be reviewed by Grand Lodge and awarded if the designated criteria were met.
- The Freedom Grant of \$1,000 is available to meet the needs of today's veterans and military members.

Thanks to the hard work of many of our volunteers at our Lodge, we have had the opportunity of receiving many of these Grants. A special shout out to Tom & Donna Schmidt, as well as James & Stacy McKenna, for organizing and managing the projects we've used to receive these Grants.

ENF has granted nearly \$11.2 million to the state Elks Associations through State Charities Grants, Special Project Grants and Bonus Grants, which help fund each state's charitable activities.

The ENF is also involved in Youth Activities. They sponsor the

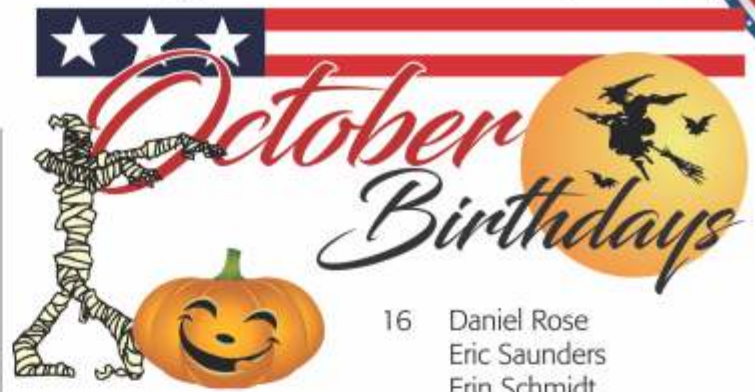

mas in 1867, only a few months after the actors had begun to meet, one of them died, leaving the actors wife and children destitute. This event gave rise to the notion that, in addition to good fellowship, the Jolly Corks needed a more noble purpose in order to endure, and serving not only their own in need, but others as well, would be appropriate. Two months later, the BPOE was started. And the rest is history as we say.

I mention this because this shows the true heart of an Elk. Helping, caring, sharing, taking care of one another, even our fellow members family. So, it would also be prudent to say, we are kind to one another. We would want to edify our fellow Elks and lift them up. A kind word can go a long way. You never know how or who your words are going to affect.

In 1990, I met a young man, I will keep him nameless, but he worked in the score board of the "Green Monster" of Fenway Park. I simply talked with him during batting practice one day. He showed me around the huge score board, and we talked for about 30 minutes, and then I went on to finish prepping for the game. I did not really give a lot of thought to it. 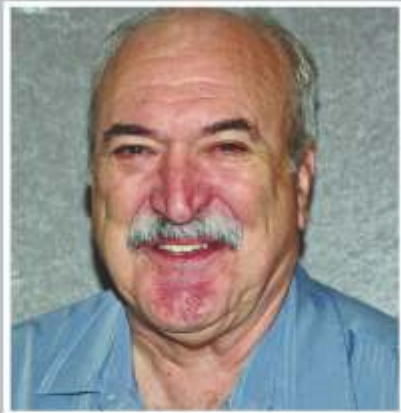
