
What's **Bothering Rashi?**

Rashi is the person upon whom all modern Torah interpretation is based. He is singular in importance in Jewish history. Once a student learns how to understand his comments, the world of deep and meaningful Torah opens wide. This course will go through selected "Rashis" from all five books of the Torah and see what he was trying to tell us. We will be using selections from the books, "What's Bothering Rashi? 1 & 2." No knowledge of Hebrew is necessary, only a desire to look at the Torah with both traditional and brand-new eyes. This course is designed by local faculty.

The Long Goodbye: **Devarim**

In the final book of the Torah, Moses halts at the outskirts of Canaan, the promised land that he will never enter, for his last oration - his long goodbye. Deuteronomy is an ending to a story that is rich in poetry and prose. It is simultaneously a review of 40 years of wandering and the surprising source for many biblical laws and ethical teachings. For 10 sessions, learners will reflect on the concepts of journey and closure and discover powerful messages for themselves. The past, present and future fuse as the Jewish nation prepares for the transition from God's direct support in the wilderness to an independent yet still faithful existence.


