Objective

Many children placed into Connecticut's foster care system, or children already in the system, are moved into a foster care placement at a moments' notice, often with no more possessions than the clothes on their backs. These gift cards will allow the children's social worker to purchase clothes, health care products, formula, diapers, etc. Our objective is to ensure that these uprooted children have items to take with them and to ensure that their immediate needs are met, as well as assist families in crisis.

The following is a list of accomplishments DCF has made over the past 14 years with the proceeds from this program.

- Provided a 15-year-old autistic girl with sensory items to provide emotional support and to decrease anxiety as she was transitioning to live with her grandmother
- Provided gift cards so the mother may purchase formula for her baby
- Provided winter and summer clothing; one outfit in every size, both genders
- PJ's, socks, underwear Every size
- Purchased diaper bags, back packs for placements that children can reuse for school
- Ability to store a package of every size diaper on hand
- Provided health care products on hand for all ages, including Black/bi-racial children
- Comfort items examples; teethers, rattles, stuffed animals, journals, flashlights, blankets, etc.
- Ability to provide snacks for toddlers, kids, and older children so if the children are brought in hungry, we have something on hand
- Provided families with gift cards to Stop & Shop or Walmart
