Book Club News

The book club met last night, following banana splits with BackSnacks and Evening Prayer, to discuss *Flight Behavior* by Barbara Kingsolver. The verdict is a brilliant, serious read that failed to resonate with our readers.

The book for June is Amor Towles' debut novel, *Rules of Civility*, published in 2011. The story is set in New York City during the late 1930s and follows Katey Kontent, a 25-year-old woman whose life takes a dramatic turn after a chance encounter with a handsome banker named Tinker Grey on New Year's Eve in 1937. This meeting propels Katey into the upper echelons of New York society, where she must rely on her wit and intelligence to navigate the challenges and opportunities that arise. (Amazon)

The next meeting is **Wednesday, June 4** following Evening Prayer at 5:00 pm.

Looking ahead, the book club will skip July and take two months to read their August selection, *The Overstory* by Richard Powers, published in 2018. This Pulitzer Prize-winning novel explores the intertwining lives of nine Americans, spanning generations, and their relationship with trees.
