DECEMBER: The BackSnacks kids hope to join us for carol-singing.


St. Nicholas Book Club News

We were a small group on September 3 but all of us were impressed with the memoir, *Love, Life and Elephants*. Dame Daphne led a remarkable life in Kenya. Once again, our book choice dealt with the natural world, this time the wild animal kingdom and its interaction with humans, sometimes gruesomely destructive and other times transformative.

For October, we chose *The Book of Longings* by Sue Monk Kidd. Published in 2020, this novel is the story of Ana, a young woman raised in a wealthy family with ties to the ruler of Galilee during Jesus' lifetime. She is rebellious and ambitious, with a brilliant mind and a daring spirit. She encounters 18-year-old Jesus, and their marriage evolves with love and conflict, humor and pathos in Nazareth. Ana's pent-up longings intensify amid the turbulent resistance to Rome's occupation of Israel, partially led by her brother, Judas. Grounded in meticulous research and written with reverence, *The Book of Longings* is an inspiring, unforgettable account of one woman's bold struggle to realize the passion and

potential inside her, while living in a time, place and culture devised to silence her. The next meeting is Wednesday, October 1 following Evening Prayer at 5:00 pm.
