STEWARDSHIP FAQ OF THE WEEK

Q: Does pledging make me a "Member"? I love St. Nicholas, but I have a specific reason to not want to be officially considered a Member.

A: Not at all!

Making a financial commitment – commonly called "pledging" – is just a way to tell the church how much income they can plan on in the coming year. Budgeting season is *now*, and in order to know how much money we can spend in 2026, we have to have some idea how much is going to come in.

The Episcopal church is a welcoming and inclusive denomination and it's understood that some have their reasons for not being ready to take the step of becoming a Member. Membership is a process, one that does not happen without your intention and consent.

So while unannounced contributions are always welcome, if you want your donation to be part of St. Nicholas' plans for next year, go ahead and let us know how much you're thinking of giving. We have handy-dandy cards available in the narthex for just that purpose. And thank you for your faithful support of St. Nicholas. We love you back!

IN OUR PARISH

Rose Brent, Senior Warden, was awarded the Bishop's Cross at Annual Council this past week. Bishop Wright instituted the bishop's cross to acknowledge and celebrate the ministries of exemplary clergy, and lay people throughout the diocese. These special people embody the diocesan purpose statement: we challenge ourselves and the world to love like Jesus, as we worship joyfully, serve compassionately and grow spiritually.

This is what the Bishop shared with Annual Council attendees about Rose: Rose Brent has been a confirmed Episcopalian for decades and a member of St. Nicholas for over 20 years. Now retired, in her professional life she was a speech pathologist for the Harris County School System for 30 years. She and her husband, John, have been married for fifty years and have one daughter (Rachel) and two grandchildren.

She served St. Nicholas as Senior Warden for three consecutive years, providing much-needed and steady leadership through some of the church's most challenging times. During her tenure, she attended for two years the College for Congregational Development of the Atlanta Diocese (CCD), which inspired her to spearheading the creation of the well-received "Gathering Room", a warm and relaxing space for

meetings and fellowship – perfect for getting to know visitors with a goal of reaching out and growing the Parish's membership. With a newly ordained priest now in place at St. Nicholas, Rose has provided the operational and spiritual leadership to see the congregation through its transition and into a new viable future. Rose represents the strength and commitment of lay leadership within a Parish and what such faithful commitment to the gospel of Jesus Christ can result in.

In addition to providing leadership as Senior Warden, Rose heads up the Altar Guild and is active in worship planning. Along with hubby John she helps maintain the church's building and grounds.

We plan to meet third Wednesdays before Evening Prayer.

November 23: We will have a <u>Share the Plate</u> fundraiser on Christ the King Sunday to help with food insecurity in Harris County after interruptions in SNAP benefits. All cash (and checks designated for the purpose) in the offering plate will go to Pocket Change, a local food bank doing good work in our community. If you know of someone who needs immediate assistance, there is a list of local resources that can help on the bulletin board in the hall.

Advent begins November 30: **Flowers & Music** donation envelopes will go out November 30. This is a beautifuly way to honor a loved one and ensure St. Nicholas has lovely flowers and special music for the holidays.

The St. Nicholas Book Club has chosen *James* by Percival Everett. Published in 2024, the novel is a re-imagining of *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* by Mark Twain. In it, Huckleberry's friend on his travels, Jim – a fugitive slave –narrates the travels rather than Huck. The novel won the 2024 Kirkus Prize, the National Book Award for Fiction, and the 2025 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. The Book Club next meets on **December 3**.

Adult Formation **December 14** after the service: "Being an Episcopalian."

Do you feel called to serve your church at a deeper, more spiritual level? Licensed Lay Eucharistic Ministry may be what you're looking for. <u>Eucharistic Ministers</u> minister to their fellow congregants by assisting the priest with Eucharist on Sunday morning. <u>Eucharistic Visitors</u> bring communion to homebound members of our church family. See Father Bob if you would like to explore this ministry.

It's Fall – Time to Recycle Those Shoes! October 1 – December 31, St. Nicholas will again participate in Keep Columbus Beautiful's Shoe Recycling drive. Bring any kind of shoes you're ready to get rid of. Rubberbanding them together is helpful, but condition does not matter. Those that can be worn will be sent to those who can use them; those that can't will be recycled – either way, they stay out of the landfill! Bin in the narthex.
