BackSnacks is Back - With Big News!

BackSnacks is an outreach of St. Nicholas Church that fights food insecurity in Harris County schoolchildren by providing food for the weekend, when school meals are not available. This project is led by Harris County High School students – including our own Aleisha McMurtry, with volunteer help from our congregation and members of the community. Kathy McMurtry works tirelessly to advise the group and provide support to the student leadership.

With the new school year back in swing, BackSnacks is gearing up again. The monthly "pack" is scheduled for the second Wednesday in the month, beginning about 3:30 p.m and wrapping up in time for Evening Prayer. While volunteer help is always welcome, BackSnacks is extending particular invitations to the St. Nicholas congregation to help get to know each other and strengthen the bond between the church and this vital outreach program.

September 10: Join the BackSnacks kids prior to Evening Prayer for a round of theatre games

that will break down barriers.

October 8: BackSnacks will host a "tasting" of the foods we pack for the kids.

November 12: Cookies, ice cream, and conversation.

December: The BackSnacks kids hope to join us for carol-singing.

And... in case you haven't heard: The **Episcopal Community Foundation for Middle and North Georgia** has awarded BackSnacks a grant of \$30,000 to renovate their workspace to make it cleaner, safer, and more conducive to operations. Work is expected to begin in the coming weeks – look for more news as it develops!

Book Club News

On August 6, six of us gathered to discuss *The Overstory*, which we all agreed was a hard read, a challenging but important work. Powers' impassioned and powerful writing brought home to us the importance of trees and other plants to human life and the impact of human actions on the natural world. We were all impressed by the longevity of trees and nature compared to fleeting human life.

For September, we chose a book highly recommended by Father Bob -- Love, Life and Elephants: An African Love Story by Dame Daphne Jenkins Sheldrick (1934-2018). Kenyan born and raised, she is the first person ever to have successfully hand-reared newborn elephants. Her pioneering work in perfecting the right husbandry and milk formula have saved countless elephants, rhinos, and other baby animals from certain death. In this heartwarming and poignant memoir, published in 2012, she shares her amazing

relationships with a host of orphans, and the love story between her and David Sheldrick, the famous Tsavo Park warden. It was "their deep and passionate love, David's extraordinary insight into all aspects of nature, and the tragedy of his early death that inspired Daphne's vast array of achievements, most notably the founding of the world-renowned David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust and the Orphans' Nursery in Nairobi National Park." 
