Report on the Stewardship Campaign

First, I would like to thank the parish for their continued generosity to St. Nicholas. For 2025, our pledge budget is \$130,800 and it is projected that we may exceed that.

During the budgeting process by the Vestry for 2026, we set our pledge budget goal at \$140,000, an increase of a little over 7.5% over 2025. The Vestry took a conservative approach in an effort to control costs even in an environment where costs are increasing at a much higher rate, particularly in utilities, insurance and the costs of repairs, maintenance, and supplies.

During our presentation of pledges on Sunday, we came in at \$102,000 which is great start as we still have several more weeks to collect pledge commitments before the 2026 budget kicks in.

If you have not had a chance to submit your pledge, you may place your pledge card in the offering plate over the next two Sundays or reach out to Erin at the church to arrange your pledge. If you have misplaced your pledge card or did not receive one, they can be found in the narthex of the church. And you can always pledge online on our church website.

Again, thank for your generosity and commitment to the future of St. Nicholas.

Cookies, Crafts, & Conversation meets December 17. We had a great group at our first meeting in November, with half of us stitching on a project and all of us enjoying tea, cookies, and chit chat in our comfortable new Gathering Room. Join us on 3rd Wednesdays at 3:00, with time to tidy up before Evening Prayer. Invite a friend!

Christmas Eve services will be held at St. Thomas in Columbus and St. Mark's in LaGrange. St. Thomas has two services, at 4:30 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. (Both services are exactly the same, except that the 10:30 service will have incense.) St. Mark's will have a Children's Pageant Christmas Eve service at 4:00 p.m. and a service with Musical Prelude at 8:00 p.m.

St. Mark's will have a **Christmas Day service** at 10:00 a.m.; there is no Christmas Day service planned at St. Thomas.

It's Time to Recycle Those Shoes! October 1 – December 31, St. Nicholas is participating in Keep Columbus Beautiful's Shoe Recycling drive. Bring any kind of shoes you're ready to get rid of. Rubberbanding them together is helpful, but condition does not matter. Those that can be worn will be sent to those who can use them; those that can't will be recycled – either way, they stay out of the landfill! Bin in the narthex.

St. Nicholas Book Club has selected *Resistance Women* by Jennifer Chiaverini as their January read. The novel is inspired by the life of Mildred Harnack, a real historical figure whose story was previously untold because the U.S. government deliberately buried it after the war. Harnack was one of dozens of members of the network of American and German resistance fighters the Gestapo called *die Rote Kapelle* (the Red Orchestra). The bulk of the action takes place between the wars, beginning in 1929; I was initially surprised that a novel about Nazi Germany before and during WWII began so early, but Chiaverini's chosen timeline serves her story well: As a reader, you see events escalate over time through these women's eyes. The setup feels leisurely, but the payoff is worth it. (from *Modern Mrs. Darcy*) The Book Club next meets on January 7, 2026.

The Annual Meeting of the church is set for **January 11, 2026** after the service. Participating in this meeting is an important part of stewardship: New Vestry members will be voted upon, the budget will be presented, and there will be reports on church programs and activities. **First Sunday Brunch** will be moved to this day so we can meet on a full stomach – plan to attend!
