St. Nicholas Book Club News: After an exciting February meeting with local author Allen Levi, the Club selected for their March read Evening Class, a 1996 novel by the Irish author Maeve Binchy. The novel is set in Dublin, where a group of men and women from all walks of life come together to attend an Italian evening class. The class is led by Nora O'Donoghue ("Signora"), a charismatic presence whose arrival transforms the lives of the students in the class. The Book Club next meets on March 4 after Evening Prayer.

The Bishop is Coming! Our Bishop of the Diocese of Atlanta, the Rt. Rev. Rob Rowe, will be joining us on Sunday, March 8. During that service, we will present several people for confirmation and reception into the Episcopal Church. Before the service at 9:30, the Bishop requests a forum with the congregation and Vestry, and we strongly urge everyone to attend.

The 2026 Hunger Walk is Sunday, March 15th. The Episcopal Community Foundation is one of the five partners in this annual event, and monies they receive are then distributed throughout our Diocese in the form of grants to be used for programs to alleviate hunger. Last year, ECF gave BackSnacks a \$30,000 grant for capital improvements! Sheri Cody is willing to register you after church services in February, just like she did last year.

You do not have to walk. You can register or give a donation without walking. Those who would like to walk will take a walk in our area versus going to Atlanta for the walk. **Our goal is to raise \$500 to fight hunger.**



Adult Forum March 29 after the service: True Hospitality. For some time we have been in the process of forming a Hospitality Team to coordinate coffee hour and other tasks associated with keeping us all sociable and well-fed; but “hospitality” in a church means far more than that.
