The 2026 Hunger Walk is Sunday, March 15th. The Episcopal Community Foundation (who gave BackSnacks a \$30,000 grant for capital improvements) is one of the five partners in this annual event. Monies the Foundation receives from the event are then distributed throughout the Diocese in the form of grants to be used for programs to alleviate hunger. So the money does come back to our area. Those who would like to walk will take a walk in our area versus going to Atlanta for the walk. **Our goal is to raise \$500 to fight hunger.**
