

Federal Updates

- The National-Level Exercise has adjusted from a 4-day functional exercise, to a shorter discussion-based exercise event due to the ongoing response operations throughout the region.
 - FEMA is currently coordinating with Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Alaska to identify discussion-based topics for inclusion in the new scope.
 - The November discussion-based recovery component is still scheduled to be held - FEMA is anticipating a day-long event with pre-developed content.
 - Economic recovery and housing are likely to be the focus areas.

State Updates

- Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) is deciding on their actions moving with the decision from FEMA.
 - OEM is considering a functional exercise in 2023 instead of activities in 2022.

Local Updates

- Multnomah County is anticipating moving forward with functional exercise play, reducing the duration of play to two days (objectives are attached to the follow-up email).
- Feedback on County objectives:
 - Logistics: County can consider exercising pre-scripted resource requests with the State of Oregon Emergency Coordination Center (ECC).
 - Mass Care & Sheltering: County can consider exercising current water supplies project MCEM Planning is engaged with. Could exercise utilizing water resources at the functional shelter operations.
 - Operational Coordination: County can exercise Continuity of Government (first 72 hours) as a build-up component of the exercise. *This could be a discussion-based exercise FEMA could develop as a component of their discussion-based program.*

Partner Participation Expectations

- Federal Executive Board (FEB): Planning to host a Communications Exercise in the fall of 2021 as a build-up component of the NLE. June 2022 exercise participation is likely to be a federal coordination meeting and development of a Situation Report that will be shared with Multnomah County. The Situation Report is to include damage assessment content to align with County Objective #2.
- City of Gresham: Likely to participate at a functional level for a single half day. Scope of this exercise will be damage assessment internal to the city, with potential to distribute up to the County EOC.
- Multnomah County Drainage District (MCDD): Planning to participate in damage assessment operations internal to the organization, with the intent to submit a report to the County EOC. MCDD is currently unsure about participation level, minimal play

would be an hour-long tabletop exercise; maximum participation would be a full day functional exercise. Interested in future communications (satellite) exercises.

- Portland General Electric (PGE): Working with ESF #12 at the State of Oregon ECC, and the RDPO, to determine level and scope of play; however, they are interested in engaging with local focus areas, specifically mass care and sheltering.
- City of Portland: City BDS is expecting to perform a functional damage assessment exercise, however there is no plan at this time to transition that content into the City ECC.
- Pacific Power: Company is not 100% settled yet on what exercise play looks like but there will be functional aspects. Focus area will likely include communications (routine & back-up) with county/state/federal/tribal partners to gather restoration priority information and create/change restore plans while also passing along priorities for route clearance to perform restore work; develop and distribute SitRep to partners highlighting impacts & restore emergency transportation routes (ETRs)

Next Steps

- Mid-Term Planning Meeting (MPM): Beginning of 2022. Action items prior to meeting:
 - Finalize organization-specific objectives
 - Finalize internal build-up plans/efforts
 - Begin development of organization-specific documentation
 - Situation Manual (Situation Manual); Exercise Plan (ExPlan); Exercise Evaluation Guides (EEGs)
 - DRAFT Evaluation and Control Personnel
 - Identify expected participants for each role & request support from MultCo if more are needed
