Course Description:

This course is based on the guidance to the Federal Executive Branch departments and agencies for developing Continuity of Operations (COOP) Plans and Programs. COOP Plans facilitate the performance of essential functions during any situation which may disrupt normal operations. This course provides the skills and knowledge to improve the overall quality and workability of COOP Plans.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this workshop, participants should be able to do the following:

- Correctly recognize background and policy regarding development of continuity plans.
- Develop a strategy to create a continuity plan using available guidance and tools.
- Recognize and incorporate all key elements of a viable continuity capability into an outline for a continuity plan.
- Explain the four phases of continuity and their application to the planning process
- Demonstrate knowledge of key concepts and strategies for developing, implementing, and updating a continuity plan.

Prerequisites:

Required prerequisites include E/L0548 Continuity Program Managers Train-the-Trainer Course or Independent Study (IS) [IS-0547.a](#). Recommended prerequisites include [IS-0235.c](#).
