ICS 300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents (MGT-904)

Purpose: This course provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS).

Course Objectives: Intermediate ICS-300 for Expanding Incidents (MGT-904)

- Describe how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents.
- Describe the incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Implement the incident management process on a simulated expanding incident.
- Develop an Incident Action Plan for a simulated incident.

Target Audience: The target audience for this course is individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents. Note: During an expanding incident, some or all of the Command and General Staff positions may be activated, as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions. These incidents may extend into multiple operational periods. This course expands upon information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. These earlier courses are prerequisites for ICS-300.

STEP 1: Obtain your SID #

- **Federal Student Identification (SID) required for each student.** DHS/FEMA has directed the implementation of the Federal SID for all HSNTF granted funded participants. If you have attended a federal training in the past 18-24 months you may already have SID #; if so, select the option "Forgot Your FEMA SID?"

The procedure for obtaining their number:

Step 1: To register, go to <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid>

Step 2: Click on the "Register for a FEMA SID"

Step 3: Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account.

Step 4: You will receive an email with your SID number. You should save this number in a secure location.
