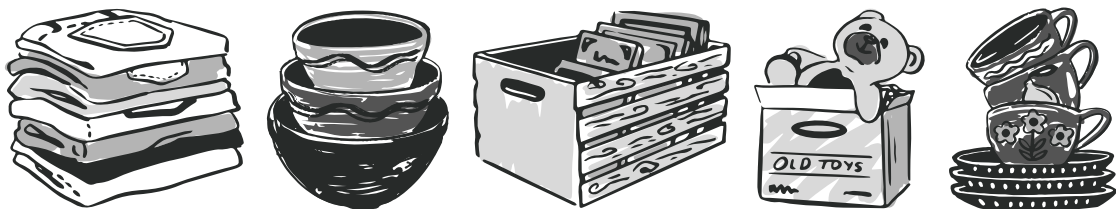

Donations

Collection Dates & Times:

- **Smaller items: Sunday mornings beginning March 29 and weekdays March 30-April 17** 10am-4pm (except Mon, April 6). Sun, April 19 is the last day to donate small items. Please take donations to **Room 235**. During the week, enter at the Office entrance and ring doorbell if the door is locked.
- Due to limited storage, **large items** (e.g., furniture and exercise equipment) will only be accepted **Tues, April 21-Thurs, April 23**.
- Donation pick-up is available. Contact Linda Soto (919-923-8904 / linsoto@gmail.com) or José Olmedo (capolmedo@hotmail.com). Send a photo of any large items with your pick-up request.
- If you'd like a receipt for your in-kind donation, please contact Kati in the office.

Tips for donating items:

- Consider if it's something you'd purchase for yourself or a loved one. Items don't need to be perfect, but should be safe and clean. Donating unusable (or unidentifiable) things creates extra work for volunteers who ultimately have to dispose of them.
- If your boxes/bags of donations have been sitting around for a while, please go through them to ensure items are still in good shape and there aren't any surprises/critters!
- If possible, sort and label containers (e.g. books, Easter decor, women's shoes). Please put items into the correct area of room 235 when dropping them off.
- No used undergarments or socks. Shoes, belts, hats, and bags should not be totally worn out. Clothing and linens (bedding, towels, table cloths, etc.) should be free of major, irreparable stains or tears.
- Electronics, tools, and small appliances should work and ideally have all parts/remotes attached to them (with tape or in a bag/box).
- Puzzles or games in loose boxes should be secured with painters tape. Toys, art supplies, or household items with many small pieces should be organized in Ziplock bags or a similar container.
