Dress for singers

- Solid red, white or navy blue shirt. Please choose a t-shirt with no logos or patterns, or with only a very small (pocket-size) logo. (If you need to buy a solid t-shirt, Michael's and Joanna's sells these for about \$4.)
- Black or blue-jean shorts, skirt or pants.

Tickets:

- Option 1: To be seated with the UCCH group in sections 209 and 211, order your tickets by August 7 through the church website, using the "Event Payment" tab. Seats are \$12 each. Tickets will be distributed at the rehearsals.
- Option 2: Use your season tickets or buy your tickets on the Bulls website or at the gate.

Gathering at the Bulls Park, August 24: Arrive at the gate by 5:30 pm. Meet in section 209 @ 5:40 pm. Consider the time it takes to park and walk when calculating your arrival time!

Rehearsals at UCCH: You are encouraged to attend all three rehearsals *EVEN IF YOU THINK YOU KNOW YOUR PART ALREADY!* You may miss one of the Sunday rehearsals if necessary, but everyone must attend the Saturday morning rehearsal.
