(Please note: CDC will also be holding Tribal Consultation after the conclusion of the CDC/ATSDR TAC Meeting; The Tribal Consultation is tentatively scheduled for August 5 at 3:00-7:00 pm (EDT); more information will be sent soon.)

The 22nd Biannual TAC Meeting will provide opportunities for tribal leaders to hear about the public health issues affecting their tribal nation. These topics will include, but are not limited to, discussions on tribal priorities for CDC and ATSDR, the COVID-19 pandemic response, and CIO programmatic highlights. We look forward to productive discussions about these critical topics.

Tribes also will have an opportunity to present formal testimony about tribal health issues. Enclosed, you will find guidance to assist you in developing your testimony for submission. This guidance is also located on the CDC Tribal website. Your testimony is highly valued and assists in strengthening our work together. All tribal leaders are encouraged to submit written testimony by 5:00 pm (EDT), Tuesday, August 3, 2021, to Captain Karen Hearod, Director, Office of Tribal Affairs and Strategic Alliances, Center for State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Support, via mail to 4770 Buford Highway, Mailstop E-70, Atlanta, GA 30341-3717, or by email at TribalSupport@cdc.gov. Based on the number of tribal leaders giving verbal testimony and the time available, it may be necessary to limit the time for each presenter.
