

The library is hosting its first Magic: The Gathering tournament with a Core Set 2020 Booster Draft! Space is limited, so sign ups are strictly required. All cards will be provided for this event, which will be single elimination, with prizes for the top 3 finishers. Players will get to keep their drafted cards.

This event is for experienced players up to age 17. Please note that unlike our Open Play events, there will be no one available at this event to teach new players the rules.



What is a Booster Draft? It's a Limited format of playing Magic: the Gathering where you draft cards - each player opens a pack, picks one card from the pack, and passes it to their neighbor, repeating this process until all the cards are chosen. Each player gets 3 packs worth of cards and builds a 40 card deck out of those cards in the allotted time. Then, players use those decks in the tournament! Lands will be provided as well, so players do not need to bring any cards with them to participate in this event.





YOUNG CASTRO AUTHOR TALK

Join us for a special evening with Jonathan M. Hansen as he discusses his new book, *Young Castro*.



This book will change how you think about Fidel Castro. Until now, biographers have treated Castro's life like prosecutors, scouring his past for evidence to convict a person they don't like or don't understand. This can make for bad history and unsatisfying biography. *Young Castro* challenges readers to put aside the caricature of a bearded, cigar-munching, anti-American hot head to discover how Castro became the dictator who acted as a thorn in the side of US presidents for nearly half a century.

The first American historian in a generation to gain access to the Castro archives in Havana, Jonathan Hansen was able to secure cooperation from Castro's family and closest confidants, gaining access to hundreds of never-before-seen letters and to interviews with people he was the first to ask for their impressions of the man. The result is a nuanced and penetrating portrait of a figure who was determined to be a leader—a man at once brilliant, arrogant, bold, vulnerable and all too human. A man who, having grown up on an island that felt like a colonial cage, was compelled to lead his country to independence.





CLASSICS BOOK GROUP


