



Judy Klitsner is a senior lecturer at the Pardes Institute of Jewish Studies in Jerusalem, where she holds the Rabbi Joshua S. Bakst Chair in Tanakh. A disciple of the great Torah teacher Nechama Leibowitz, Judy has had a profound impact on a generation of students, of whom many now serve as teachers and heads of Jewish studies programs in the US, the UK and Israel. Judy's teaching style is lively, accessible, interactive and text-based, and she is particularly fond of uncovering the "vibrant conversation" that takes place between the Bible's parallel stories. She has lectured at a myriad of venues throughout the world, including synagogues, campuses and adult education programs that span the denominational spectrum. She has taught Bible to Christian and Muslim audiences and has held a visiting lectureship at the London School of Jewish Studies. Judy Klitsner is the author of *Subversive Sequels in the Bible: How Biblical Stories Mine and Undermine Each Other*, which received a National Jewish book award. She is the founding board chair of Sacred Spaces, an organization that works to systemically address abuse in Jewish institutions. Judy has recently launched a joint Pardes-Sefaria pilot for an original commentary to *Chumash*.
